Siskiyou Sheriff Lists Activities For Period

YREKA—Sheriff A. B. Cottar reports the following activities involving the Siskiyou County sheriff's office and the county jail between Nov. 26 and Dec. 9.

Wesley Peyton Justice, 21, Yreka, was arrested by California Highway Patrolmen Nov. 27 and booked at the county jail on charges of being drunk in and about an automobile and contributing to delinquency of a minor.

Arrested with him on charges of drunk driving and violation of curfew was a 17-year-old Yreka youth. Justice was found guilty in Yreka Justice Court, and is in jail pending report of the county probation officer. The juvenile involved was referred to juvenile authorities.

Blaine Merton William Toftum, 40, Mount Shasta, was arrested by Yreka police Nov. 25 and booked in the county jail on charges of public intoxication. He was later released on bail.

Ted Gary Isquardo, 24, a salesman from Central Valley, was arrested by sheriff's deputies Nov. 25 for violation of the California civil code as an outcome of vacuum cleaner sales in the county on a conditional sales contract basis. He was released after posting bail.

On Nov. 28 Mrs. Dorothy Grune of Greenview reported to Cottar that unidentified juveniles shot both her stock dogs in the yard of her home on Nov. 27.

She said she and her husband noticed the boys going by the house with a gun. Shortly after they found both dogs injured, she said. After investigation by sheriff's deputies, two local juveniles were cited to appear in juvenile court.

Frederick Delmar Knox, 46, Anderson, was arrested by CHP officers near Macdoel Nov. 28, and was booked at the county jail on charges of being drunk in and about an automobile. He was later released on bail.

Edward Thomas Musselman, 53, Sacramento, was arrested by Yreka police on the same date and booked at the county jail on charges of public intoxication. He appeared before Judge George Tyler of Yreka Justice Court and was sentenced to serve five days in the county jail.

Sheriff's deputies Nov. 29 investigated acts of malicious mischief at Etna. Vandals entered the post office lobby during the night and tore down signs and generally created havoc.

Charles Elgin Eddington, 30, San Diego, was returned to the county by a member of the Sheriff's Aero Squadron Dec. 3, following issuance of a bench warrant by the county superior court charging him with violation of probation after a forgery conviction. He is being held in the county jail pending further court action.

Earnest Neil White, 19, Seattle, was arrested by CHP officers Dec. 4 and booked at the county jail on charges of carrying a concealed weapon. Later, acting on advice of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, he was questioned by sheriff's deputies and admitted theft of an automobile in Seattle.

He is in the county jail at present in lieu of \$1,500 bail, pending further court appearances.

Leslie Clarence Bennett Jr., 23, Forks of the Salmon, was arrested Dec. 3 by Yreka police and booked at the county jail on charges of drunk driving and driving with a suspended operator's license. He appeared before Judge Tyler and was sentenced to serve 70 days in jail or a fine of \$365.

James Beverly Westfall, 33, was arrested Dec. 2 by Yreka police and booked at the county jail on a bench warrant issued from Yreka Justice Court. He was released after posting the balance of a fine.

R. B. Ford, 36, an artist, Yreka, was arrested by sheriff's deputies Dec. 4. Patrons of a Montague bar reported that Ford held a gun on them, then fled the scene in a car. The license number had been spotted and deputies later located the car parked a few miles away, and watched it until Ford returned.

He was arrested and booked at the county jail Dec. 7 on charges of assault with a deadly weapon, and was later released on bail.

Stanley Wendell Riley, 25, Weed, a tractor operator, was booked at the county jail Dec. 2 after conviction in Mount Shasta Justice Court of charges of drunk driving. He was sentenced by Judge John Kinstry to serve five days in jail and to pay a fine of \$325, or, in lieu of the fine, to serve further time in the county jail.

Glenn Franklin Rutledge, 40, Montague, was booked at the county jail Dec. 8 on charges of disturbing the peace. He was arrested by Chief of Police Al Widner of Montague. He appeared before Judge James B. McAdams of Montague Justice Court and was sentenced to a term in the county jail, or to pay a fine of \$157.50.

James Justin Cousins, 29, Dunsuir, a truck driver, was booked at the county jail Dec. 7, after his appearance in Mount Shasta Justice Court on charges of overloading his logging truck. He was sentenced to serve 172 days in jail or to pay a fine of \$961.

Charles Newsom, 33, was sentenced to serve 90 days in the county jail Dec. 7. He entered a plea of guilty of theft before Judge L. M. Chase of Dorris Justice Court.

Newsom was returned to the county Dec. 5 following his arrest in Los Angeles to answer a warrant from Siskiyou County issued following a sheriff's investigation in 1957. Newsom was charged with stealing \$300 from a Chiloquin, Ore., man.

Lawrence Reuben Rowell, 28, Klamath Falls, was booked at the county jail Dec. 8 after his conviction in Tulelake Justice Court on charges of driving with a suspended license, no vehicle registration and speeding, following an arrest by CHP officers. He was sentenced to pay a fine of \$363 or to serve 73 days in the county jail.

Michael Allen Wright, 18, San Jose, was returned to Siskiyou County by sheriff's deputies on Dec. 8 to answer traffic warrants issued from Mount Shasta Justice Court.

He appeared before Judge John Kinstry and was sentenced to serve five days in the county jail.

Joseph Mihaesi, 32, Montague, was arrested by sheriff's deputies to answer charges by the state labor commissioner of violation of labor code sections. He was released after posting \$300 bail.
