

Former Klamath Falls Man Fatally Hurt In Accident

A former Klamath Falls man, Mr. Stephen McGill, 52, was fatally wounded by his own gun at his home in Meridian, Ida., Dec. 19. Word of the accident reached his two brothers, Wilmer and Leonard McGill, this city.

Mr. McGill was a carrier driver for the Ellingson Lumber Company here for several years. At the time of his death he was acting chief of police of Meridian.

His service revolver was in need of repair and he was working on the weapon when it was in some way discharged. The bullet entered his head.

He is survived by the widow, Dorothy, one son, John, his mother, Mrs. John McGill, all of Meridian; also four brothers and two sisters.

Driver Charged With Hit, Run

A Klamath Falls tavern owner was charged with hit-run and drunk driving in municipal court Wednesday morning. He asked for time to consult an attorney.

Vern Carl Fahlgren, 38, 4359 Summers Lane, was arrested Tuesday by state police on South Sixth Street after he allegedly hit a car at the intersection of South Sixth and East Main streets. The damaged car belonged to Gerald Hyde, 308 South Seventh Street.

Another auto incident occurred Tuesday but there were no injuries or citations. Cars driven by Gladys Iola Runnels, 41, Harman Route, Klamath Falls, and Walter Earl Blessinger, 66, 2105 Ohio Street, collided in front of 220 North Eleventh Street. Officers said the cars skidded on an icy pavement.

Police also investigated a report that a woman and child were going from door-to-door on Eldorado Street asking for money for a local church. Such soliciting is illegal under the city's Green River Ordinance.

Marion Monfore, Malin, reported that the hubcaps were stolen from his car.

Ex-Local Instructor Dies

Donald L. Norlin, 48, a former teacher in Klamath County schools died in a Salem Hospital, Dec. 15. He had been in failing health for some time. At the time of his death he was head of the Salem Area, Right of Way Division, State Highway Department, a position he had held for the last five years. He served in a similar capacity at Roseburg prior to moving to Salem.

During the years the family lived here Mr. Norlin taught in the Altamont, Bonanza and Herley schools, prior to World War II. He served in the Navy. The family home is at Rt. 5, Box 138, Salem.

Survivors include the widow, Greta, Norlin, Douglas, both of Salem and a son Kurt in the U.S.

Freeman Contemplating Fresh Thinking On Farms

WASHINGTON (AP)—Gov. Orville L. Freeman of Minnesota, designated to be the secretary of agriculture in the Kennedy administration, wants to do some "fresh" thinking before deciding on new federal farm programs.

Freeman declined at a news conference here Tuesday to be drawn out on policies he will pursue in an effort to carry out pledges of President-elect John F. Kennedy to improve farm conditions.

Freeman flew here from Minnesota to meet with Secretary of Agriculture Ezra Taft Benson.

The secretary spent 75 minutes giving his designated successor a briefing on his job and the problems he will have to tackle after Jan. 20.

Benson and Freeman had a cordial session in which Benson promised to do all within his power to help make the transition from the present to the new administration go smoothly.

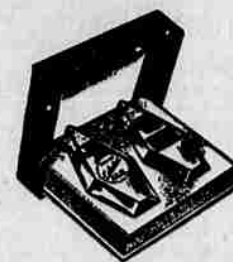
This cordiality gave little evidence of the sharp difference between the two men on the farm issue.

Benson wants to get the government out of agriculture, while Freeman believes government should do more to help farmers solve their problems, particularly that of surplus production.
