SALEM (AP)—The state Board of Parole and Probation will ask the Legislature to add 15 parole officers to its present 42, H. M. Randall, board director, said today.

If the Legislature approves the extra 15 men, Randall said, these parole officers will have about the same work load that they had two years ago. At that time, the national probation and parole association recommended a reduction in the work load.

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Boat Licenses Being Processed

SALEM (AP) - The Oregon state Marine Board at Salem said Wednesday that it now is processing applications for the new orange colored 1961 boat licenses.
The annual license is required on boats using 10 or more horsepower regardless of size and all boats 13 feet and over in length regardless of horsepower or type of propulsion.
Fees range from \$3 for those under 16 feet to \$5 up to 20 feet and \$5 plus \$1 for each additional foot or part of a foot in excess of 20 feet.
