The Thorn Tree And Its Legend

An unusual Christmas phenomenon, of which a great many people have not heard, may be witnessed in the Cathedral of the Close in Washington, D.C., or in Glastonbury, Somerset, England.

In both places may be seen a tree, called the Holy Thorn, which blooms faithfully in the ancient English town every Dec. 25th. The tree in Washington, an offshoot is not quite so reliable, always blooms in December however.

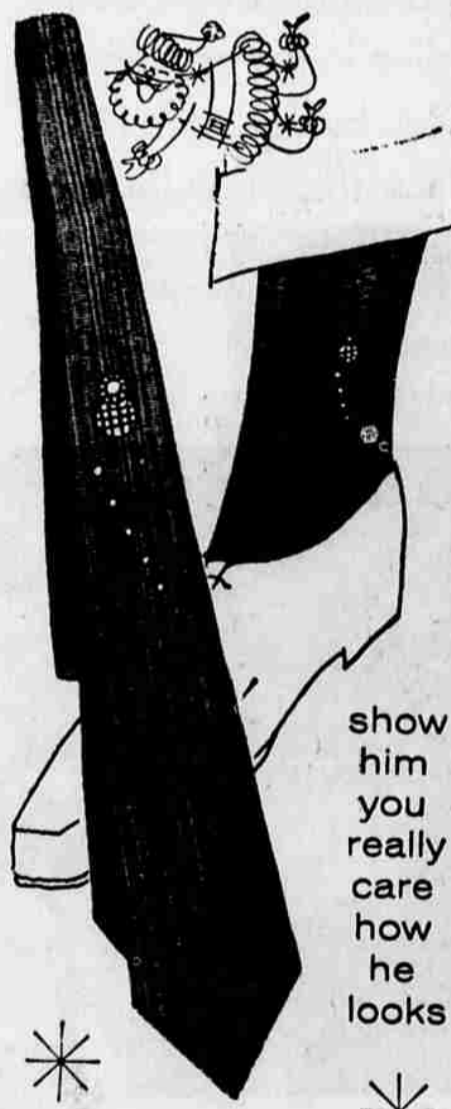
Legend tells the story of the Holy Thorn thus: two days before Christmas, sixty-three years after the birth of Christ, St. Joseph of Arimathea arrived out-

side Glastonbury. He carried with him the Holy Grail, the chalice used at the Last Supper. He and his followers were fleeing from Palestine, looking for a place to settle.

As St. Joseph came toward Glastonbury, he stopped to rest on a hill overlooking the town. He drove his staff into the ground and it took root right then. The next day, Christmas Eve, it had become a thorn tree and was covered with blossoms.
