

Bill Would Create New Resource Adviser Board

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Clair Engle, D-Calif., has drafted a bill to create a special council of resource and conservation advisers to the president.

He said in a statement the bill, to be introduced next month, is designed to implement a campaign proposal of President-elect John F. Kennedy and would set up a council to coordinate planning for development of the west's natural resources.

Rep. John Moss, D-Calif., also announced he will sponsor a similar measure in the House.

OTTAWA (AP)—Canada's Finance Minister Donald Fleming Tuesday night took new budget steps to encourage Canadian business in the current economic slowdown and to reduce the influx of foreign capital investment.

Fleming also told Commons he anticipates a \$286 million budget deficit for the current fiscal year ending next March 31.

Soviet Union Is Aiming At Industrial Automation

BALTIMORE (AP)—The Soviet Union is mounting a major scientific effort aimed at converting its industries to automation, a study team of mathematicians said Friday.

The conclusion was made by an 11-man panel after studying recent Soviet contributions to mathematics.

"There is reason to believe that the U.S.S.R. can achieve a rapid acceleration in its rate of technological progress by an all-out scientific program in the field of automatic control," the 350-page report said.

Migrant Worker Cleared Of Slaying

EUGENE (AP) — A migrant agricultural worker arrested two weeks ago in California on two Lane County warrants has been cleared of any connection with the Aug. 29 slaying of Alice Louise Lee, according to sheriff Ed Elder.

Elder said Thursday that Donald Orrie Northey, 35, who was questioned about the unsolved murder of the small girl in a Trent beanyard, submitted to a two lie detector test after being turned here Wednesday from Delano, Calif.

Northey meanwhile faces prosecution on the two charges for which he was arrested in California on Lane County warrants — larceny in a dwelling and failing to provide for minor children.

Bail was set at \$1,500 on each charge.
