

Two Escape Accident With Bumps

Both drivers escaped serious injury early Saturday morning when their cars collided at the intersection of Washburn Way and Shasta Way.

City police report the crash occurred just after midnight and involved cars driven by Roy D. Wiltse, 2638 Eberlein, and Howard E. West, 702 North Eleventh Street.

Both men were checked and treated at Klamath Valley Hospital and released.

Wiltse was cited for failure to yield the right of way.

The authorities reported that an auto overturned on the Old Fort Road about 5 a.m. Saturday, also with no injuries.

The vehicle was driven by William Charles Mayhew, 15, 2009 Farga Street, who was accompanied by Shirley Mayhew, 39. They report that the car missed a curve near the dump grounds, struck the right shoulder of the road, veered across the road, hitting the left shoulder, then overturning in the center of the road.

Another police report involving an auto was listed at 8:20 p.m. Friday when Mrs. Ralph M. Stephens, Rte. 1, Box 54, Bonanza, reported the theft of her 1957 model auto from Ninth Street between Main and Klamath.

The car is a Chevrolet hardtop, blue-green in color with white top, has a carrier rack and bearing California license RDV 726.

Crop Value Drops Some Food Short

SACRAMENTO (UPI) — The value and production of California crops dropped slightly this year from the record levels set in 1959, it was reported today.

William E. Warne, director of agriculture, said that California farmers produced 31,108,000 tons of crops in 1960, a drop of 3 per cent from 1959 production.

Warne tentatively estimated total crop value in 1960 at \$1,904,313,000, a decrease of 2 per cent from the record value established in 1959.

The agriculture director's statement was based on an annual report prepared by W. Ward Henderson, chief of the California Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Despite the dip in crop output, Warne noted that production in 1960 was 10 per cent greater than the 1950-59 average and nearly double the annual average during the 1930s. If the trend of recent years continues, Warne said, California can look for another increase of about 20 per cent in crop production by 1970.

"This high level of production in 1960 was sustained in what we consider a dry year," Warne said. "This was primarily because the bulk of the state's crop production is from irrigated land."

Warne said that average prices of individual commodities varied from 1959 levels, but the general level in 1960 was slightly higher than the previous year. "At the same time," Warne said, "farmers' costs have continued to mount and net profits have not increased."

In his report, Warne noted: —Field crops, total production of 17,820,400 tons, were down 3 per cent from the 1959 record tonnage, but were 16 per cent above the 10-year average. Corn, wheat, flaxseed, beans, sugar beets, field seeds and hops were down, but rice and hay advanced to new records, and cotton and potatoes were higher than in 1959.

PENDLETON, Ore. (AP) — An 18-year-old son of a U.S. Highway 30 west of here claimed an Idaho man's life Saturday.

Dead on arrival at St. Anthony's Hospital was Tony R. Jensen, 29, Blackfoot, Idaho, killed 22 miles west of here.

Injured in a separate accident on the same highway was Edna Terry, 55, Ogden, Utah.

Jensen's death brought the Oregon traffic fatality total to 459 for the year in the Associated Press tabulation, December has seen 30 killed.

The Christmas weekend toll in Oregon was brought to three. Two children were killed earlier in a five-car smashup near Ontario.
