"The Day Christ Was Born" by Jim Bishop.

The old but ever new story—the story of Christmas—the greatest of all Christmases, the first. This splendid author has retold a compassionate tale in a moving and reverent manner. The book draws on Biblical and other sources but also includes imaginary dialogue and minor scenes not found in the New Testament.

The journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem was related with the fervor of the great miracle which was about to take place. The travelers were weary and they had been forced by Caesar's orders to return to the cities of

their fathers to be counted. They spoke little and Joseph had the worries of any traveler and the greater worries of his wife's condition.

Darkness had fallen when they reached the city, it was overcrowded, and the innkeeper clearly stated there was no room for them, but his wife suggested the cave where the animals were sheltered. Joseph showed deep concern, but Mary remained calm and asked to go to the cave quickly. She knew the great moment of his birth was approaching, the great event which gave us our first Christmas.

It is a stirring book and will be enjoyed by religious people and people of all faiths who love and cherish the true meaning of Christmas. It contains four colored reproductions of famous paintings. The story is most colorful and could be considered a companion to "The Day Christ Died" by the same author.

"The Ardent Years" by Janet Stevenson.

Fanny Kemble, an English actress of high spirits, an idealistic nature and by her English standards, provincial, retired from the theater without regret, to become the wife of Pierce Butler, a wealthy American planter. Her independence does not fit in with Pierce's family and friends so Fanny finds herself constantly suppressing her ideas and actions to become the proper Mrs. Butler.

The novel is most interesting and deals more with Fanny's tempestuous marriage than with her early life as a 19th Century Eng-

lish actress. Early scenes in the book, however, emphasize her theater life and her own debut at 19 as Juliet.

The main plot deals with her stormy marriage. Her independence and high spirits do not fit in well with her husband's requirements for absolute submission in a wife. Their completely opposed views about slavery, slave labor, and the upbringing of their two little daughters, whom Fanny adored, led to many unhappy circumstances.

Fanny had a gift of greatness and was far ahead of her time. She was horrified when she found out the Butler livelihood came from slave labor on Georgia plantations.

It is all a heart-rending story of Fanny's predicament and Pierce Butler's unhappiness and frustration. The author has beautifully portrayed the life of this wonderful woman, her times, her love, and her suffering; but the book is more significant for its view of the contemporary social scene than for character development.

Their differences of opinion first led to quarrels, then coldness and finally to divorce. Fanny, with her indomitable courage, built a new life for herself. She had no money, but alone and penniless she achieved success and reached the pinnacle of her fame in a new career.

Army Comes Up With An Almost Instant Bread

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — The Army has come up with a preparation which could be described as almost instant, near-bread.

Designed primarily for battlefield kitchens, the mixture can be prepared and baked in 45 minutes. It contains flour, shortening, a bit of sugar and a chemical yeast substitute called Delta-Lactone.

But after the Army got together the bread-appearing concoction it ran into the problem of making it taste like something hot out of mother's oven.

The Quartermaster authorities called in the firm of Arthur Little, Inc., of Cambridge, Mass., and San Francisco, and the food technology department of the University of California at Davis.

Little's researchers came up with an additive including cottonseed meal and glucose, which give the Army's mixture a homey flavor.

Electronic Line Does Everything

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Bad news for fish and good news for fishermen is a new electronic fishing line developed by U.S. Steel Corp.

The line, or warp as fishermen call it, was made in Worcester, Mass., and is being tested on an exploratory fishing vessel off the Pacific Coast.

The device tells fishermen the exact depth of their nets, whether the nets are on the bottom, the ground speed of the trawl and the size of the catch. The fish just don't have a chance.
