

Two Kinds Of Merry Christmas

BERLIN (AP)—There were two kinds of Christmases in this divided city.

West Berlin celebrated as did West Germany — thousands of Christmas trees, huge meals, presents, churchgoing, bright lights, excitement for the children.

Stores were crammed with shoppers in the city's most prosperous postwar December.

Most Germans in the Eastern Sector would like to celebrate the same way. But they live under an atheistic dictatorship.

But the Communist press lectures on a new way of celebrating around the Christmas tree. They call it the Tannenbaumfest, or Fir Tree Festival. Instead of children singing carols and reciting traditional poems before receiving their gifts, they submit to a political quiz. Those who show they have absorbed their Lenin and Marx get gifts.

East Berlin's Christmas market in Marx-Engels Square had roller coasters, acrobats and shooting galleries. A series of cutout figures were from German fairy tales. But Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs promoted "collective labor." And the main decoration was a massive sputnik and the sign "socialism wins."

Illustrated magazines in the West were lavish with color pictures of church interiors, snow-capped mountains and other seasonal subjects. The controlled Eastern press was heavily loaded with political pronouncements.

East Germany's humorous magazine Eulenspiegel devoted most of last week's issue to a mockery of Christmas. The star of Bethlehem was the U. S. Air Force poking its nose over the trees of a wintry landscape.

But the Communists did not succeed in eliminating the Christmas spirit.

"My son came home from school in tears," an East German mother said. "He had been asked to take his accordion to play at the school party. But the teacher bawled him out when he played a Christmas carol. 'Only Socialist tunes can be played here,' she told him."

"My husband had been told to work in his factory all through the holiday. A special rush order for the Soviet Union, they told him."

"It didn't seem like Christmas. They don't like it. But we drew the curtains and had a real family Christmas at home. That's what most people did."

A reporter who traveled in East Germany said Christmas trees were set up in the market squares of towns. They were even a lot of manger scenes on sale in stores.

The East German Communists, who claim they are antimilitaristic, have allowed toy soldiers to be sold for the first time. They are East German and Soviet soldiers.

Military toys were frowned on in West Germany and West Berlin also during the Allied occupation. This year there are plenty of guns, tanks and rockets for sale.

Ronald died two days after his mother and four brothers and sisters were buried in Twin Hills Cemetery in Pennville, Ind. The flash fire was caused by an exploding jar of gasoline.

509 Acres Burned In Klamath Protective Group Area

The Klamath Forest Protective Association summed up the year recently by tabulating 37 man-caused and 37 lightning fires burning a total of 509 acres.

The review revealed that the past fire season was one of above average fire danger with little or no precipitation and the burning index being high or extreme for long periods of time during the summer.

KFPA reports that this year they put the latest tool in fire suppression, the air tanker and fire retardant chemicals to work.

BROOKLYN, N.Y. (UPI)—The Brooklyn Dodgers were the team home run champs of the National League in 1962 with a total of 19.
