

Gift Starts Memorial For Victim

NEW YORK (AP)—An anonymous gift of \$1,000 has started a memorial fund for Stephen Baltz, 11, the boy whose fight for life after an airplane collision won the sympathy of the nation.

The money was sent to the Methodist Hospital of Brooklyn, where the boy died 27 hours after the crash that cost 135 other lives here Dec. 16.

The donor was described at the hospital only as "an elderly maiden lady."

The gift, along with other money being received in the boy's memory, mostly in denominations of \$1 to \$5, will be used to establish a memorial room on the children's floor of the hospital.

Fire-blackened coins found in the boy's clothing—five nickels and four dimes—will be fused into a memorial plate to be hung in the room.

The Rev. Donald Stockdale Stacey, the hospital's field chaplain, said the hospital has been "swamped with mail from all parts of the country."

Some letters contain contributions, but most represent expressions of sympathy.

Ike's Son Is Tapped

WASHINGTON (AP)—Lt. Col. John Eisenhower will go to the Army War College in Pennsylvania after his father leaves the White House.

He has been serving as a military assistant at the White House since 1958.

The younger Eisenhower's name appeared today on a list of 163 officers selected to attend the class at Carlisle Barracks, Pa., starting Aug. 17.

The Army said Col. Eisenhower will be given other duties prior to the beginning of the 10-month course at the institution which prepares selected officers for higher command and staff positions.

Shortly after President Eisenhower's first inauguration in 1953, his son was assigned to nearby Ft. Belvoir, Va. He had previously been on duty in Korea.

John Eisenhower and his family live in Gettysburg, Pa., close to the farm home where the President and Mrs. Eisenhower plan to live in retirement. Gettysburg is about 30 miles from where John will be stationed.

French Doubt Brigitte Will End Her Career

PARIS (UPI)—"She can't do that to us," says French manhood, and Frenchmen don't think she will.

That's the male reaction here to Brigitte Bardot's announcement last week that she is going to quit the movies in 1963 and retire on her not inconsiderable earnings. Her only reason was that she's tired of it all or, in the French equivalent, she's had it.

Movie men as well as the French man in the street are disbelieving.

Jack Wiener, Columbia's European publicity manager who has been associated with Bardot ever since her "And God Created Woman" made her an international star, said "I can't believe it."

"I am sure she will change her mind," he said. After all she has changed her mind before. After her tremendous success in her last movie "La Verite" (The Truth) which critics in Sweden praised as displaying her as a new Greta Garbo she can't give up.

"She has become an actress after starting as a pin-up, and she will get a taste for it although she will probably become more difficult in choosing her pictures and will make fewer of them."

From the Paris connoisseurs, most typical Paris men in the street, the reaction is simply "she can't do that to us." They explain that in spite of her tumultuous private life "she is a good girl" and they like to see her in movies where she undresses and even in the others where she acts.

Strong Magnetic Field Spotted

PASADENA, Calif. (AP)—An astronomer reported today that he has discovered the strongest magnetic field ever found in nature—34,000 times stronger than that of earth.

The find was made by Dr. Horace W. Babcock, assistant director of the Mt. Palomar Observatory, with the 200-inch Hale telescope at the observatory.

The magnetic field surrounds a star which is a neighbor of our solar system in the Milky Way galaxy. It has no name but is known to astronomers as HD 218441.

Pastor Does Away With Carnivals

WEST NEW YORK, N. J. (AP)—The pastor of a Roman Catholic church here says there'll be no more carnivals, bazaars or raffles to get funds for parish needs.

Instead, church members will be asked to donate 10 per cent of their gross income to the church and church-approved charities.

The Rev. John P. Weigand said Monday he was taking the step to put an end to the church's "carnival atmosphere."

It is called tithing. In New York City, a spokesman for the Jesuit weekly magazine "America" said the custom of tithing is virtually unknown to Catholic parishes in the United States.

But he said—Father Weigand would be within his rights in specifying to parishioners how to apply the law of the church, which obligates all Catholics to contribute to church support.

Father Weigand is pastor of St. Joseph's Church of the Palisades. The parish contains 7,200 families and is one of the largest in the state.

He said he had been preparing pastoral letters and pronouncements for the new year for 10 weeks by a series of not be considered compulsory.

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
