

Protection For Salmon Requested By Hatfield

SALEM (AP) — Gov. Mark O. Hatfield told his Natural Resources Committee Tuesday he wanted it to come up with a proposal that would help protect salmon spawning beds now being destroyed through sand and gravel dredging.

Hatfield said that millions are spent on artificial propagation and that it would be an economy measure to preserve natural spawning areas.

Hatfield, however, rejected a proposal of the Fish Commission for the right to veto sand and gravel dredging permits if spawning beds were endangered.

The governor said this was similar to a proposal that did not even get out of committee in the last legislature.

"I personally think that (the veto) is bad administration," he said, adding that he opposed assigning a task to one agency and then giving another a right to veto.

He said it was obvious there was a difference of opinion, but said the committee should be able to come up with a flexible proposal that would help answer the question.

Hatfield said the Land Board has no legal authority to consider spawning when it leases the sand and gravel beds. The revenue from the leases goes to the common school fund.

Hatfield asked for a proposal that would incorporate these three principles: provide a program to cover streams over which the land board has jurisdiction, aim at a more comprehensive law covering public and private lands, amend the land board law to give the board authority to consult the Fish and Game commissions before granting the leases.

Man Arraigned

EUGENE (AP) — A grand jury next week will take up the double slaying Monday at Junction City.

Police Chief Woodrow Whetstone, 43, and Everett Fletcher, 54, both of Junction City, were killed by shotgun blasts. Another shotgun blast wounded Mrs. Verne Mae Milligan, 42-year-old divorcee.

Robert Evans, 45, who was jailed on a first-degree murder booking, was arraigned Tuesday on a charge of killing the police chief. Dist. Atty. William Frye said the whole matter would go before a grand jury.

Frye said witnesses told him Evans was a former suitor of Mrs. Milligan. He said Fletcher and Mrs. Milligan went to Whetstone's house for help after seeing

Evans in town with a shotgun. When Whetstone came outside, he was shot down, then Fletcher and Mrs. Milligan.

Mrs. Milligan was reported in fair condition at Sacred Heart Hospital in Eugene.

Rancher Dies

NEWBERG, Ore. (AP) — Funeral services will be held Friday in McMinnville for a widely known rancher and horse trader, Harry Richard Kuehne, 69.

He died at his ranch near Carlton Monday, of a heart attack. Kuehne was affiliated with the Blue Lake Packers at Salem and the Farmers Cooperative Creamery. He also was a charter member of the St. Paul Rodeo Association.

Among survivors are a widow, two daughters and a sister.

Vessel Damaged

BROOKINGS, Ore. (AP) — No one was injured when heavy seas slammed the disabled 45-foot crab boat Mary Jane onto the beach here Monday.

Earlier a big wave damaged the vessel's rudder.

The Mary Jane ran into trouble as it was trying to enter the Cheico River Harbor.

After the boat crashed on the beach, two tractors hooked onto it to help keep the waves from battering it to pieces.

Look For Body

PORTLAND (AP) — Search continued along the Tualatin River today for the body of a duck hunter who fell into the water Thursday.

He was Robert Beardslee, about 30, of Sherwood. His companion, Dan Reber, 30, also of Sherwood, said their canoe capsized when Beardslee shot at a duck.

Reber managed to reach shore, but Beardslee disappeared. The accident happened between Scholls and Six Corners. Police said brush and sunken logs have hampered the search.

BBC RED-FACED

LONDON (AP)—Red-faced officials of the British Broadcasting Corp. have apologized to Queen Elizabeth for blanking out the opening words of her address to the nation on Christmas Day.

Millions of television and radio listeners missed the first eight or nine words of the monarch's annual message when the sound reproducing machine broke down at the start of the recorded talk.

Search Ended

MANZANITA, Ore. (AP) — The Navy ended its search for an Air Force plane that plunged into the sea near here two weeks ago.

Sheriff's deputies reported that a wing and some smaller parts of the F102 jet interceptor have been washed ashore.

A helicopter picked up the plane's pilot, who bailed out.

Flemming Opposed For Post

SALEM (AP) — Gerald Detering, president of the Oregon Farm Bureau Federation, is opposed to having the secretary of health, education and welfare, Arthur S. Flemming, become president of the University of Oregon.

"Flemming's ill-advised action against cranberries brought about a tremendous loss to Oregon growers, followed by similar attacks on milk and capons in what was termed the 'food of the month' plan," Detering said Tuesday.

On Nov. 9, 1959, Flemming announced that the 1958 and 1959 cranberry crops were contaminated by a weed killer. Later, the Oregon Department of Agriculture said Oregon cranberries were not contaminated.

The state Board of Higher Education has said it is considering Flemming for the university presidency.

Detering added that "Flemming's irresponsible action in regard to several important crops has not improved his stature as an administrator. Certainly, his action caused great loss to Oregon producers, and was not in the best interest of our state and its people."

He said the Farm Bureau believes that Flemming has "alienated the farmers of Oregon," and that the university president should have the backing of all the people.

BOISE, Idaho (AP) — Papers were to be mailed to California Wednesday asking extradition of Roger Hall on a charge of robbery in connection with the robbery-slaying of Dr. John Hunt.

Hunt, a Portland, Ore., forester formerly of Bellingham, Wash., was shot to death and robbed near Bliss, Idaho, on Aug. 23, 1959.

Hall, 22, of Crescent City, Calif., was acquitted in Gooding, Idaho, recently of a first degree murder charge in the case.

Gov. Robert F. Smylie signed extradition papers on the robbery charge Tuesday at the request of Gooding County Sheriff Keith Anderson. Hall was taken into custody on the charge last week in Humboldt, Calif.

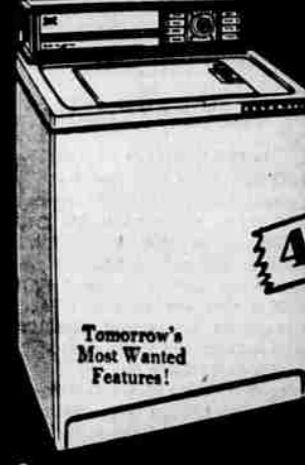
