## Lift Spirits With Perfume

Newspaper Enterprise Assn. American women are fairly sophisticated about the use of perfume these days. The belief is vanishing that perfume is for use only in late afternoon or evening.

More and more, women are using perfume for their own enjoyment. They like the way a certain perfume makes them feel, be it feminine and lacy or exotic and slinky. They've progressed far beyond the point of dabbing a bit on a handkerchief.

They've learned, too, to back up the perfume they use with matched scents in cologne and dusting powder rather than risk clashing scents. And they're long onto the trick of renewing a perfume during the day from time to time.

A real charmer to help them along in this respect is a wand-like cloudy crystal bottle holding an exotic and sophisticated perfume. It's for touch-ups daytime and evening and can be carried conveniently in handbag or evening bag.

To get the most mileage from this or any other perfume, use it at the inside bend of the arm and give yourself about 20 minutes before venturing into open air. This is to give the perfume a chance to "set." Otherwise, it will vanish on first contact with open air.

Be neither timid nor lavish in using perfume. The best method is to experiment until you learn just how much perfume seems right for you.

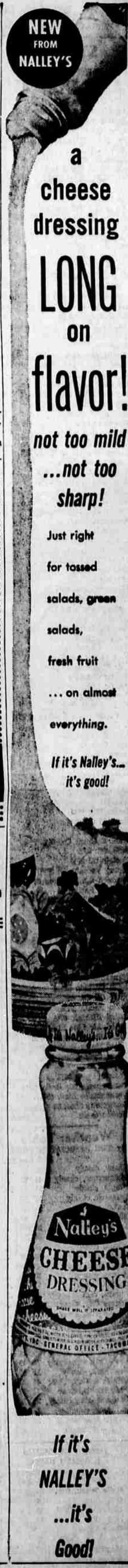
