Geologist To Study Ore Veins

OREGON STATE COLLEGE — An Oregon State College geologist has received a \$23,000 grant from the National Science Foundation for a unique three-year study on distribution of ore in mine veins. High speed data processing machines will play a supporting role in the study.

The findings will be valuable in predicting anticipated ore deposits and distribution in mines. Such information is almost nonexistent now.

Project leader is Dr. George S. Koch Jr., geology department. Cooperating with him is Dr. Richard F. Link, statistics department.

They will do basic research into the distribution or "zoning" of ore in the veins of two large mixed-metal mines in Mexico. Extensive mine workings during the past 50 years have exposed large blocks of ground to geological inspection and hundreds of thousands of mine assays are available.

By processing the mine assays on the high speed computers, Koch and Link hope to come up with answers to some important questions on ore deposits.

These include: In what directions and at what rates do the percentages and contents of the various metals change? Which metals are zoned in a statistically significant sense and how? Does mineralogical bottoming in a single vein indicate bottoming of the entire ore deposit at that elevation? Were metals in different parts of a vein or ore deposit emplaced at different times or by different processes?

The job of processing such assay data was impractical before the development of the high speed data processing machines.

Koch was a geologist at one of the mines from 1952 until he joined the OSC staff in 1956. He will collect research information during summer and Christmas vacations. Koch and Link have been studying metal zoning in the mines since 1958 with research grants from the OSC graduate school. Preliminary work was reported in September at the International Geological Congress in Denmark.
