Searing Heat, Biting Cold Tell Oregon's Weather Story For Year

Searing heat and biting cold provided the highlights of Oregon's weather in 1960. No records were set, but the high temperature came close.

Spray recorded 115 degrees July 18, only four degrees below the record of 119 at Pendleton and Prineville in 1898, the Weather Bureau said.

The coldest for 1960 was Seneca's January reading of minus 31. Seneca has the record low, 54 degrees below zero, in 1933. January saw Western Oregon's heaviest snowfall in 10 years—drifts reached 8 to 10 feet high in Portland and schools over large areas of the state were forced to close.

The worst weather of the year came in November, when heavy rains caused severe flooding in the Willamette Valley. Scores of families were evacuated and extensive damage was suffered by homes and crops.

Heavy winds hit the coast in November, too, and freak waves moved homes off their foundations. In Bend in Central Oregon, 3.63 inches of rain fell in 48 hours. The bureau said Valsec in the Coast Range was the state's wettest spot with 124.35 inches of precipitation for the first 11 months of the year. Crater Lake had the most snow—467.3 inches.

New Schedule Will Help Taxpayers

Form 2948, the new federal tax schedule to aid taxpayers in computing the more liberal medical expense deductions they are entitled to if they, their wives, or their dependent parents are 65 or over, is now available at local Internal Revenue Service offices.

A. G. Erickson, district director of Internal Revenue for Oregon, said a new law, passed this year, provides that the deduction for medical expenses incurred for a dependent parent 65 or over will not be reduced by three per cent of adjusted gross income, as in the past.

However, as in prior years, if either the taxpayer or his wife has reached age 65 before the close of the tax year, the medical expenses of both can be deducted without being subject to reduction by three per cent of adjusted gross income, he added.

He said the new Form 2948 will clarify medical expense instructions which will accompany Forms 1040 and 1040W to be mailed to taxpayers after the Christmas holidays.

Erickson said most taxpayers are not affected by these special provisions and may continue to compute their medical expenses deduction on the regular Form 1040 or 1040W as they have done in the past.

Boswell was Oregon's 466th traffic victim this year in the Associated Press tabulation. Thirty-eight have perished this month.
