

# Sentencing Of Resort Planner Is Postponed

YREKA—Mrs. Libby McNeil, who last spring announced plans to build a fancy year-around resort in Siskiyou County, arrived at the sheriff's office here Tuesday noon bearing a writ of habeas corpus issued from Judge J. Everett Barr of the county superior court.

Her pending 30-day jail sentence for non-payment of wages was postponed. She was released after posting \$3,500 bail. Judge Barr ordered a hearing in superior court Jan. 20 to determine validity of her claims that Judge Kenneth Stone of Weed Justice Court failed to inform her of all her legal rights during recent court action there.

Appearing with Mrs. McNeil were the representatives of the Tebbe and Correia law firm, Yreka.

Mrs. McNeil was charged in September with five counts of failure to pay wages, failure to secure compensation insurance and misrepresenting a term of employment, by Shirley and Dale Wade and Ronald, Leonard and

Raymond Kelly, Tennant, who allegedly were hired to help convert the old Long-Bell Lumber Company logging camp into a cultural playground.

Mrs. McNeil was found guilty of two charges of failure to pay wages. She was either found not guilty of the remainder of the charges, or they were dismissed. Mrs. McNeil, during the trial, stated she had made arrangements at that period with a deputy labor commissioner in Redding to pay wages due. She stated she had made local arrangements for payment while she and her husband, Stephen, her partner in business, were taking care of business in San Francisco. The arrangement apparently broke down without her knowledge, she said. Judge Stone set Oct. 27 for sentencing.
