PORTLAND (AP) — Two more small post offices in Central Oregon have been burglarized, postal authorities here reported today. Both occurred Christmas Eve.

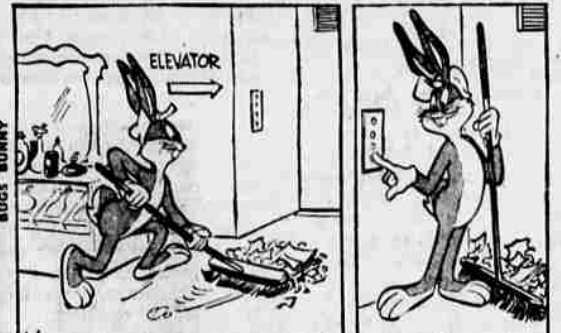
At Terrebonne, the burglar sprang a door with an axe, and made off with 266 blank money order forms and a set of limitation and date stamps, authorities said.

The other burglary was at the Shaniko office, where a window was kicked in and \$32 in cash taken, a postal inspector said.

Earlier in December, the post office at Camp Sherman was burglarized.

EXPRESS RATES UP
WASHINGTON (UPI) — A 20-cent rate increase on some railway express shipments went into effect today.

The increase, approved Wednesday by the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC), applies to less-than-carload shipments between all points on most commodities. Milk, cream and daily newspapers are exempted.
