## Property Picked

WASHINGTON (AP)—The new federal building to be built in Medford, Ore., may be located on East 10th between South Riverside and South Central avenues.

The unit first was offered for sale Oct. 11. The regulation provides that if no bids are received, award may be made within one year to any qualified bidder who meets the requirements of the original sale offering.

The area contains an estimated 3,000,000 board feet of ponderosa and Jeffrey pine, advertised and bid at \$24.65 per thousand feet (M); a nominal volume of sugar pine, advertised and bid at \$33.40 per M; 4,700,000 feet of white and Shasta red fir, advertised and bid at \$6.85 per M; 1,300,000 feet of Douglas fir, advertised and bid at \$13.35 per M; 200,000 feet of incense cedar, advertised and bid at \$6.85 per M, and a nominal amount of lodgepole pine, advertised and bid at \$3.45 per M.

# 10-Year-Old Girl Takes Stand In Dorris Court

DORRIS—A 10-year-old girl testified that Isaac Leonard Skidmore, 62, a Mount Hebron beekeeper, molested her recently, during a preliminary hearing for Skidmore, charged with child molestation, in Dorris Justice Court Thursday afternoon.

The girl was called to the stand by Siskiyou County District Attorney Albert H. Newton Jr. Newton also called a deputy sheriff to the stand, who told of an alleged confession by Skidmore of the assault, "out of curiosity." The confession was made at the county jail in Yreka, the deputy said.

Judge Chase bound Skidmore over to the county superior court and continued bail at \$10,000. Skidmore was returned to the county jail. He was represented by Harry Hammond, Yreka attorney.

The hearing had been set for Jan. 11, but because the date was convenient to the district attorney, in that a trial had been dismissed, therefore leaving an otherwise full calendar with a vacancy, Newton took advantage of the break.

Louie Soles, 58, Mount Hebron, also known as Louie Gonzales, appeared, too, in Dorris Justice Court Thursday afternoon for arraignment of charges by deputies of child molestation. The same 10-year-old girl was involved, deputies believe.
