Question: I have an old electric table saw that I use for cutting wood. It performs satisfactorily, except that I have to eat a lot of work inside to cut it, since most of my projects are outdoors. I have seen workers on new houses using portable circular saws. Are they practical for home use?

Answer: There was a time when only the building industry used portable circular saws, their big advantage being that they could be brought right to the building sites and used for many cutting operations. Then some stores and dealers began to rent such machines to the public for tough construction jobs. Finally, the manufacturers began to put out smaller models within reach of the average pocketbook.

The portable circular saw now is widely used in home workshops and on farms throughout the country. As long as its power is given proper respect, it will perform wonders in the saving of time and effort. Many safety features have been built into these saws since they first were introduced, among them special clutch arrangements designed to eliminate cutbacks. But they must still be handled carefully, the most important thing being to give the saws your undivided attention. Never, never look up to talk to someone while you are operating the saw. Incidentally, with the use of special blades, these saws now can cut ceramics, slate, marble, tile and many other materials as well as wood.

Folks Needn't Feel Old At 90, Doctor Advises

 NEW YORK (UPI)—Baron Andrew von Salza, a contemporary Ponce de Leon, maintains that folks do not have to feel old at the age of 70, 80, 90 or beyond.

The San Francisco physician, a specialist in rejuvenation, studied the art of turning back the hands of time in Germany, Russia and Italy.

During an interview at the Savoy-Hilton Hotel in New York, Dr. von Salza illustrated what he meant about not feeling old — even though the chronological age is "three score years and ten."

"For a simple example," he said, "suppose two houses were built at the same time—say 75 years ago. One house was kept in constant repair, painted regularly, the roof kept in good condition, all plumbing properly looked after.

"The other house had nothing done to it from the time it was built and has become a disreputable, almost tumble-down shack. True, both are 75 years of age. But would it be fair to consider the life-span of the two as the same?"

Dr. von Salza said human bodies are like the two houses. One can be young at 70—provided it's properly cared for. And another can be old at 50 because it was neglected.

The physician said about 70 per cent of physical ailments are psychosomatic in nature and so, too, is aging largely psychosomatic.

"Therefore to rejuvenate the body while the mind is saturated with thoughts of senility would not be effective," he said. "On the other hand, to expect a healthy mind to produce a healthy body without providing necessary elements conducive to youth would likewise be a fallacy."

Dr. von Salza recommended thinking young to those who feel like senile derelicts. And he recommended proper nutrition, plenty of exercise and good medical care to provide the body's physical plant with the best possible chance of staying young.

He said it's vital to start the

prevention of senility as a social task.

"But much more, each person should start such a program as a personal task since at the present state of things, nobody is immune to becoming a senile derelict—if we live long enough," he said.

Dr. von Salza said quite frequently one becomes a senile derelict overnight — even though senility is not prepared overnight.

"It is prepared," he said, "through years of neglect of the body."

"Remember that any machine—and our body is a machine—is just as strong as its weakest part is strong. Look at your weak points—the wrinkles, difficulties walking up a hill, tiredness, slips of memory.

"Start to rejuvenate yourself before even such signs develop because when they do develop, your body is sounding alarm.

"Listen to it better than you listen to noises in your ear. You can buy a new car, but not a new body."
