Marcia Louise Groves, 7 lbs., 3 oz. baby girl, arrived Friday, Jan. 7, to become the first daughter born to a pastor in the First Presbyterian parish in Klamath Falls in 76 years.

Her parents are the Rev. and Mrs. Robert C. Groves. Her brothers are Bobby 11, Tommy, 7, and Charles (Chuckie), 4.

CORVALLIS (AP)—Survival of the human race is the problem that faces people of all nations today, a world affairs expert said Wednesday at Oregon State College.

People can not look to the past for rules because the present world crisis is completely new, said Dr. George B. Chisholm, president of the World Federation for Mental Health.

Chisholm, former chairman of the World Health Organization, was keynote speaker for International Week here.

Every intelligent person in the world is frightened, and ought to be, Chisholm said, because for the first time man is capable of destroying the human race.

Green Ashamed Of State Lack

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Edith Green, D-Ore., said Wednesday she is ashamed that Oregon is one of eight states not taking part in a free food program for needy persons.

She urged Gov. Mark O. Hatfield of Oregon to make use of a plan under which state public welfare recipients could be given agriculture department surplus food.

"Frankly, I am ashamed that Oregon should be on the very short list of those states which for some obscure reason refuse to participate in this program," she wrote the governor.

Under the program, surplus foods can be given to the state for distribution to persons in need. There is no charge for the food and the federal government pays for transporting it to a distribution center in the state.
