## Budget Lists Reclamation Funds, Plans

A number of reclamation and civil works projects in Oregon are included in President Eisenhower's proposed budget.

Rep. Walter Norblad, R-Ore., said he had been informed these Bureau of Reclamation projects will be in the budget:

The Dalles (Western division) \$350,000; Klamath (Oregon and California) \$1,034,000; Rogue River Basin (Talent division) \$789,000; Vale project (Bully Creek extension) \$690,000.

Other Bureau of Reclamation projects Norblad listed:

Reconnaissance study for John Day project on the Columbia River, \$42,000; continued investigations on Umpqua River, \$30,000; rehabilitation work in Rogue River Basin, \$150,000.

For operation and maintenance, Crooked River Basin, \$20,000; Rogue River (Talent division) \$38,000; Klamath (Oregon and California) \$55,000.

Norblad said the President's budget proposals would include \$3,800,000 for the Bureau of Indian Affairs in Oregon—with \$270,000 earmarked for rehabilitation of the Chemawa Indian School near Salem.

The Bureau of Land Management budget for Oregon-California grant lands in Western Oregon will be \$9,200,000, Rep. Norblad reported. That amount includes a \$1,200,000 increase for building access roads on O&C lands, reforestation projects and recreation facilities.

The Bureau of Commercial Fisheries budget includes \$4,000,000 in funds to be transferred from the Army Engineers to finance Columbia River fisheries research, Norblad reported. This item includes an increase of \$224,000 for expanded research on the problem of fish migration over dams, the congressman said.

Rep. Norblad also reported the budget message would contain funds for these Dept. of the Army civil works construction projects:

Lower Columbia River bank protection (Ore. and Wash.) \$600,000; Rainier drainage district, \$381,000; Sauvie Island drainage district, \$239,000; John Day lock and dam, \$31,000,000; McNary lock and dam, \$285,000; Columbia River mouth, \$700,000.

## Medical Mirror

### Blood Test for Heart Attacks

- Pinworms
- Simple Explanation
- Bloody Urine
- Cold Milk

Q. Will you please write about the blood test for heart attacks?

A. You are probably referring to the "transaminase test." Various body tissues contain substances (enzymes) which seep into the blood stream when tissue is injured. The heart muscle, for example, contains transaminase, which is released following certain types of "heart attacks." By testing the blood for transaminase, doctors are able to better diagnose, treat, and follow the patient's progress.

Q. In Medical Mirror you said that pinworms are transferred from person to person. How?

A. Pinworms leave the lower intestinal tract of an infected person and lay eggs on the skin around the anal opening. Other people pick up the eggs from the patient's clothing or objects handled by the patient, or by swallowing airborne eggs or in various other ways.

Q. Is it harmful for a person to "put off" going to the bathroom to urinate?

A. Probably not, for males. For females it might definitely be harmful. The reason is that the female urethra (tube leading from bladder) is short. Unless it is frequently flushed out by urination, time is allowed for bacteria to get up into the bladder and cause infection. This would be less likely to occur when the urge is respected.

Q. If bloody urine turns normal after a day or so should you see a doctor?

A. Yes. You should have a thorough examination if you ever have blood in the urine. Otherwise, you are risking what could be a symptom of a serious condition requiring prompt treatment.

Q. Does the chilling of milk affect the vitamin and protein content?

A. No.

## Federal Judge Cautions College On Integration

ATHENS, Ga. (AP) — Two Negro students return to classes at the University of Georgia today under a court order of a federal judge said must not be frustrated by violence and disorder.

An armed prowler created excitement Sunday night when he appeared at a dormitory and told a guard he was looking for the Negro girl enrolled in the school. Police were told he drew a gun when asked to identify himself, relieved the guard of his gun and fled. The incident occurred about 9:30 p.m.

A thorough search of the campus was made but the man, described as short, stocky and about 35 or 40 years old, eluded detection.

The Negro students, Charlayne A. Hunter, 18, and Hamilton E. Holmes, 19, of Atlanta, were suspended after last Wednesday's campus disorder was quelled by tear gas.

U.S. Dist. Judge W.A. Bootle enjoined school and state officials from again removing them on the ground that unruly demonstrations endanger their personal safety.

Earlier the jurist barred state officials from cutting off funds for the university as required by state law for integrated schools.

## Demos Plan Big Celebration; GOP Stages Transition Ball

WASHINGTON (AP) — If ever there was a week for Democrats to celebrate, this is it. On Friday, one of their own, John F. Kennedy, will be inaugurated president, ending eight years of Republican federal rule.

And the Democrats mean to celebrate, starting tonight with a reception for one of their venerable leaders, House Speaker Sam Rayburn, 79.

The Republicans, however, won't be entirely left out in the cold. The soon-to-be "outs" cut into a week of partying for the new "ins" with a "Transition Ball" tonight in honor of the outgoing Eisenhower administration. What started out as a modest affair has gotten unexpected response from Republicans.

They hope to muster 15,000 to dance until midnight to a 13-piece orchestra.

Ball chairman Lyman Brownfield explains: "There are some people who have some reservations about attending certain functions this month, but do, nevertheless, want to take part in a ball to have fun and say goodbye to their many friends."

Texas, including Vice President-elect and Mrs. Lyndon B. Johnson, are expected to dominate the Rayburn reception to which some 250 persons have been invited. Soft music and a sumptuous buffet will mark the party given by Mr. and Mrs. Rowland

Boyd of McKinney, Tex., for Rayburn and his two sisters, Mrs. W. A. Thomas of Dallas and Mrs. S. E. Bartley of Bonham, Tex.

Throughout the week, Washington will be on a party kick with scores of dances, receptions, dinners and private celebrations.

Kennedy himself is coming back from Palm Beach Tuesday and will put in an appearance at a party his sister, Jean Kennedy Smith, is giving for the east of the inaugural gala.

The gala is a star-studded evening of entertainment being produced by Frank Sinatra and Kennedy's brother-in-law, actor Peter
