# KU Wrestlers Win Two; Run String To Nine

## College Basketball Roundup 'Top Ten' Results At A Glance

**No. 1: Ohio State**  
COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—Ohio State won its 13th straight game, beating Minnesota's ball-control tactics 75-56 Saturday night. The Gobblers, beaten for the 11th time in 14 starts, broke into an 8-1 lead by playing a cautious ball-control game. They held the Buckeyes without a field goal for the first 4 1/2 minutes of play. Ohio State, led by John Havlicek and Larry Siegfried, settled down to an aggressive, ball-hokey defensive game and went ahead to stay, 9-8 on a three-point play by All-America Jerry Lucas. The Buckeye's Lucas scored 22. Havlicek added 16.  
Dick Erickson was the leading Gopher scorer with 14 points. Tom McGrann added 13.

**No. 2: St. Bonaventure**  
BUFFALO, N.Y. (AP)—St. Bonaventure cracked the fast-break whip Saturday night to beat tough Canisius, 96-76, before 11,787 fans. The second-ranked Bonnies got a fine 28-point performance from Tom Stith as they ran their season record to 15-1. But sophomore Fred Crawford provided the first half fireworks as the Bonnies locked it up early.  
Crawford counted four straight baskets, including three stunning fast breaks, as St. Bona built a 33-15 lead with the game only 14 minutes 'o'd. Before they were through, the Bonnies had run their margin as high as 25 points.

**No. 4: Iowa**  
LAFAYETTE, Ind. (AP)—Purdue's Bojermakers swung their hammers in slow motion Saturday and knocked over Iowa's Hawkeyes, No. 4 nationally in the Associated Press ratings, 47-41. Purdue led 23-14 at the half in the meeting of teams unbeaten in Big Ten play.  
Iowa, coming to the end of a 10-game winning string, trailed only 41-39 with less than two minutes to play and tried to rattle the Bojermakers with a full court press. It only succeeded in committing fouls that let Purdue expand its margin.  
The fifth-ranked Cardinals quickly forged ahead by eight points in the last nine minutes and built up their cushion.

**No. 5: Louisville**  
LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP)—Louisville turned on the power in the second half Saturday to roll by Dayton 63-50 in a nationally televised basketball game.  
The Flyers, who had run neck and neck with the Cardinals in the opening minutes of the second half, suddenly collapsed and went nearly seven minutes without scoring a point.  
The Cardinals quickly forged ahead by eight points in the last nine minutes and built up their cushion.

## EBL Boss Boiling At NFL's Rozelle

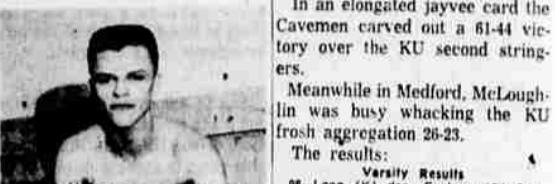
WILKES-BARRE, Pa. (AP)—The suit will accuse Rozelle of defaming the morals and standards of the EBL, Rudolph asserted.  
Lipscomb was to have made his professional basketball debut in Baltimore last night against Williamsport. The game was canceled because of a snowstorm. He has been wrestling professionally during the off-season.  
The EBL, an eight-team "minor league," has sent 11 players up to the National Basketball Association in the last few years, said Rudolph. He said this to show that the NBA, the "major league" of basketball, had not felt it would be contaminated.  
A spokesman for the Baltimore Bullets said:  
"We know the fans are for us and we hope he (Rozelle) is somehow aware of their feelings. Perhaps he will reconsider and correct what we believe to be a most regrettable injustice."  
The Colts had agreed to let Lipscomb play for the Bullets.  
"These boys," said Rudolph, "have paid their penalties and the public has accepted them. They have proven to be true gentlemen and outstanding basketball players. Larger crimes have been committed and the criminals welcomed back to society."  
"We have long felt that our allowing these boys to play in our league served as a good source in rehabilitation. They were young and immature when they made their mistakes, misled by selfish, corrupt people out for their own gains."  
Four EBL players were convicted of "point shaving"—or fixing the point spread of a game to the advantage of gamblers—while playing for New York colleges in the early 1950s.  
They were Sherman White, now with Baltimore; Ed Warner and Floyd Layne, both with Wilkes-Barre, and Ed Roman, player-coach at Williamsport. White served a prison term.  
In addition, Bill Spivey of Baltimore was tried on a perjury charge. He had denied accusations that he attempted to fix college games while playing for Kentucky.  
His 1953 trial ended in a hung jury and the charge against him was dropped.

A convincing 48-8 triumph over the Bend Lava Bears on Pelican Court Saturday afternoon ran the Klamath Union varsity wrestling team's unbeaten string to nine straight matches, but they came discouragingly close to watching it snap at seven straight Friday night at Grants Pass.  
The KU grapplers evidently shook off any bad after-effects of their narrow 24-21 win over the Cavemen in time to face the Bend contingent.  
Friday night the whole match rested on the broad shoulders of heavyweight Gary Hancock but he came through with a timely decision and then came back to grab another Saturday.  
Saturday the Pels won eleven bouts and lost only two, one in the 168 and one in the 178 pound divisions, and scored 17 take-downs, five escapes, four reversals and six pins. Bend notched three take-downs, six escapes, three reversals and only one pin.

Bill Grisel pinned Pelican Larry McClure in 1:35.0 of the first round in the 168 pound class to tie the Cavers 19-16 lead. Art Mills evened the count by deciding Bob Pfandler at 178 but the count remained tied after Joe Cox and John Morris battled to a 1-1 draw in the next to the final bout at 191.  
In an elongated jayvee card the Cavemen carved out a 61-44 victory over the KU second stringers.  
Meanwhile in Medford, McLoughlin was busy whacking the KU frosh aggregation 26-23.
