

Allowable Cuts Figure On Klamath

An increase in the Klamath National Forest's allowable cut from 170.8 million board feet to 183.4 million board feet per year has been announced by Forest Supervisor Charles A. Yates. Approval of the Forest's Timber Management Plan by the Washington office of the U.S. Forest Service preceded the announcement. The net increase reflects changes in the allowable cut for the Salmon River Working Circle. New allowable cuts for these administrative units were calculated after recent reinventory work and boundary changes. The reinventory job and other work done under the new management plan was under the supervision of Forester John S. Spencer Jr., now assistant district ranger on the Goosefoot District. Foresters Theodore V. Kubitz, Marcus W. Petty, Richard C. Nule and Everett R. Winter also worked on this important task at various times in the past three years.

Charges Against Six In Loan Case Dropped

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—Charges against six of 12 persons indicted in the \$8 million collapse of the Equitable Plan Loan Co. have been dismissed by Superior Judge Martin Katz.

Katz Friday ruled the statute of limitations expired before the six were indicted by a grand jury. Charges were dismissed against: Stewart B. Hopps, San Francisco insurance man; Virgil D. Dardi, New York banker; Joseph L. Seltzer, New York businessman; Walter P. Smith, Inglewood, Calif., and Leon Drenner, Los Angeles accountant.

from 30.0 million feet for the Salmon River Working Circle is largely due to more accurate inventory data. Actual realization of this large cut is predicated on successful solution of remaining road access problems.

The largest increase occurred on the Goosefoot Working Circle which combines the old Ball Mountain and Goosefoot circles. Allowable cut rose from 13.0 to 21.7 million board feet.

Boundary changes were made to give greater flexibility in location of sale areas. The remaining three working circles on the forest have been re inventoried and new allowable cuts will probably be announced for the Happy Camp, Somes Bar and Scott River Working Circles within the next 18 months.
