

Roosevelt Takes Hold Of Company

SHeldon, Iowa (UPI)—Elliott Roosevelt, 40, actively assumed executive control of the Northern Biochemical Corporation today in an effort to untangle the intricate financial crisis that has hit this small community.

One week has passed since Mrs. Burnice Iverson Geiger, 58, admitted she made away with \$2 million from her father's bank, the embezzlement forced the bank's closure.

This was followed quickly by the disclosure that Mrs. Geiger was a large stockholder in Northern and the arrest of Harold E. Kister Jr., former head of Northern, for aiding and abetting the alleged embezzlement.

Townpeople still are wondering what happened to the \$2 million. If authorities know, they aren't saying.

Roosevelt arrived in Sheldon Monday to take over control of the corporation.

Auditors and federal examiners have been hard at work for days unraveling the shadowy financial lacework linking Northern and the shuttered Sheldon National Bank. Roosevelt shed little light on the complex affair when he met with newsmen and Northern's 126 employees Monday.

Northern's 126 employees came out of the session with their jobs intact, at least for the time being.

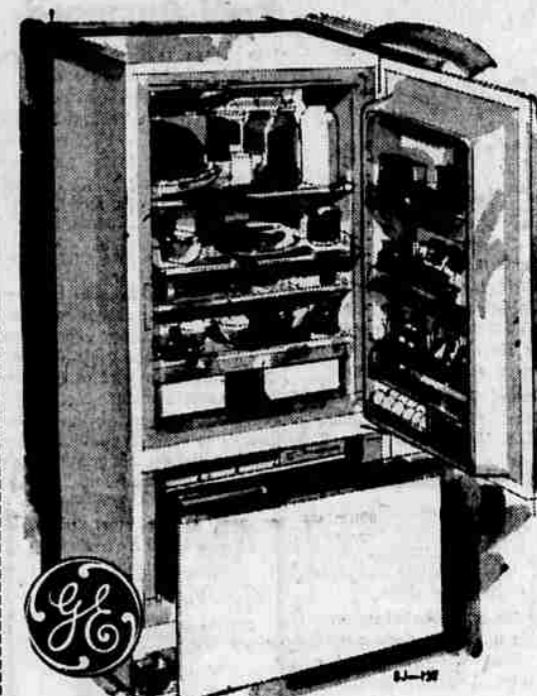

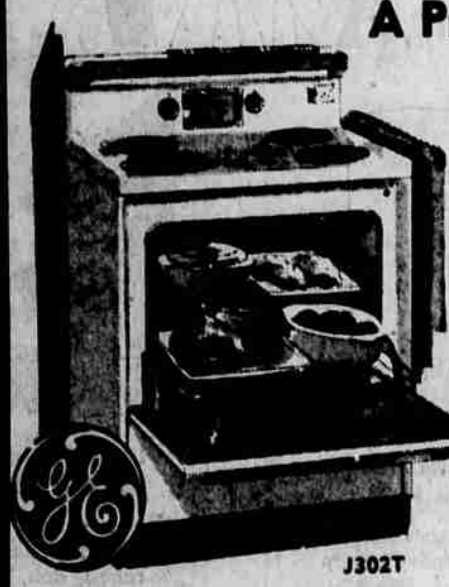
