

Home Run Mark Looms At Wrigley

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — Gene Autry's horse champion didn't show up, but otherwise all the Hollywood trimmings were on display Tuesday when new Los Angeles Angels of the American League celebrated the signing of their first players.

The honored guests were a big man and a little one. The big man was Bob Cerv, who modestly said he didn't expect to break Babe Ruth's record for homers in Wrigley Field, where the Angels will play. But left unsaid was the thought that a minor leaguer, Steve Bilko, hit 56 homers in the same park in 1957 when he was with the old Los Angeles Angels of the Coast League.

Bilko's back with the Angels, but Tuesday was Cerv's and Albie Pearson's day. "I'm sort of anxious to get going with the new organization," Cerv told about 100 sports writers while newsreel cameras clicked. "Sure I like the park. I've never played here but I was in a home run derby for television filmed in Wrigley Field last year."

Tiny Albie, looking more like a jockey from nearby Santa Anita than a major league outfielder, then got on a chair while he, Cerv and Autry, sans horse, posed with the caps and uniform blouses of the new club.

Autry, who combines the job of singing cowboy star with that of radio and television executive and board chairman of the new club, was quick on the quip.

When a voice in the rear asked, "who's your favorite cowboy actor?" Autry beat Cerv and Pearson to the punch by saying: "If either one of you says Roy Rogers, you're in trouble."

Cerv flew out from his Kansas City home for the ceremony honoring the first two players signed by the new club. Pearson saved the Angels money by motoring over from his home in Riverside, Calif., 60 miles away. The tiny Pearson, who stands 5 feet, 5½ inches and weighs 141 pounds, got in on the home run talk by admitting he once hit a homer in Wrigley Field while he was with the old San Francisco club of the Pacific Coast League.

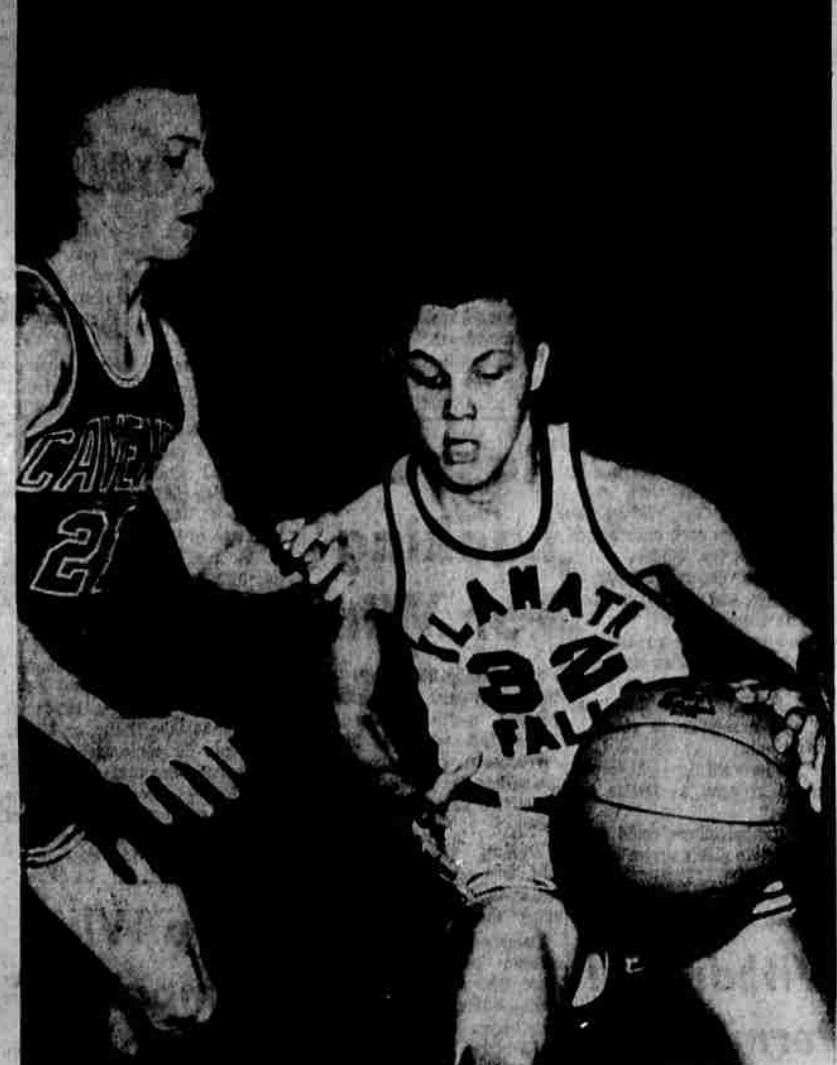
Y-Church Scores Low

Powerful SOC Opponents Make Big Plans For Pels

If the Klamath Union Pelicans can get through the coming week and successfully, they can't expect to afford to let up, but they will at least be able to breathe a little easier for a while.

Friday night they journey to Grants Pass for their second meeting with the Cavemen and they expect no mercy, either while they're there or after they return home.

Saturday night the KU cagers have to prove to the Medford Black Tornado that their 28-26 win at Medford a week or so ago was no fluke. And that could be a bit rough even though they do meet the Tornado on friendly soil.

They can't afford to look much past Friday night, either. Mixing with the Cavemen on their home ground is not an easy assignment. Although the Cavemen have no scorers higher on the conference point ladder than positions eight and nine, they have a definite edge over the Pelicans in the height department.

The Cavemen have won five and lost four but are showing steady improvement. From both an offensive and defensive standpoint however, the GP quint trails the Pelicans.

The Pels have the same three men, Wally Palmberg, Bruce Brickner and Gary Patzke listed among the top five scorers, in that order. Palmberg is third by one point behind Crater's Loyl Higginbotham who guided the Comet threat against the Pels the last time they met.

The number one spot, by quite a margin, still belongs to the Tornado's highly-touted Bob Quinney. Quinney has 234 points for the season to date as compared to 202 for Higginbotham and 201 for Palmberg. Quinney, however, has a one game edge over his competitors.

Pel guard Freddie Biehn and forward Ray Taylor hold the 13th and 16th spots respectively among the leaders.

Larry Janssen and Clyde Murray are the leading Caver shooters. Janssen eighth with 123 to date while Murray is next with 105.
