PORTLAND (AP) — The editor of the conservative Oregon Voter said Monday the 1961 legislature is one of the best, most experienced the state has had in years.

"There is not much chance for extreme legislation passing," Walter W. R. May told the weekly Chamber of Commerce members forum luncheon.

He said the conservative coalition leadership in the Senate and the close balance of power in the House creates a good climate for desirable legislation but a poor one for extreme measures.

May said a majority of the legislators are successful men who understand Oregon's problems, adding:

"The 1961 legislature will not easily be brainwashed on labor, education, welfare or tax bills."
