New OTI Health Service Proves Valued Addition

The OTI Student Health Service was organized at the beginning of this school year with Mrs. Natalia S. Reichenberg as registered nurse in charge of the service and Dr. E. E. Howard as consulting physician.

The facility consists of a waiting room, recovery room, treatment room, and nurse's office. Originally, the patient load was approximately two students per hour. This number increased to 4.2 students per hour at the end of fall term due presumably to winter weather and student awareness of the service offered.

Approximately 91 per cent of patients to date have had minor cold-weather ailments. Two were hospitalized for severe tonsillitis.

Two diabetics have been discovered and treated and diets have been worked out for these by the nurse. Lacerations, broken wrists or fingers, injured eyes, sprains and strains and one severe car accident injury have made up the other nine per cent.

In any case requiring attention of a physician, students select their own doctor. Doctor fees are not paid under this service. Students may have X-rays and medical lab work performed on campus. Issuing of penicillin or prescription-type drugs must be approved by the medical consultant.

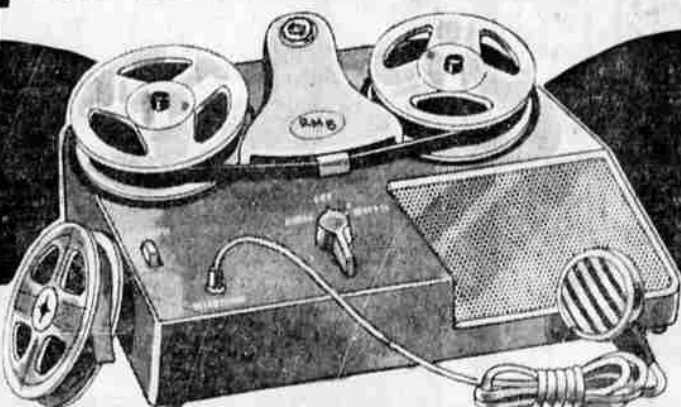

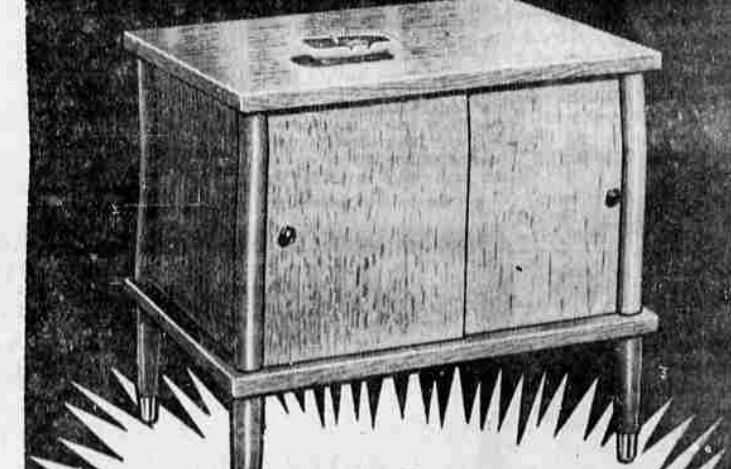
