World Day Of Prayer For Missions Slated

On Feb. 17, 12 million women in the United States and millions of others around the world will celebrate the 75th anniversary of the World Day of Prayer for Missions.

Few of those who read this will remember when the World Day of Prayer got its start in 1887. It began as a day of prayer for home missions. While it was a Presbyterian woman, Mrs. Darwin James, who conceived the idea, it was immediately adopted by other denominations. Within a very few years, Methodist, Episcopal, Baptist, Reformed and Congregational women were observing such a day.

It was two Baptist women, Mrs. Helen Barrett Montgomery and Mrs. Henry Peabody, who started the observance of prayer for foreign missions in 1890. They were leaders for many years in the ecumenical movement. Not only did they start a day of prayer for foreign missions but they also set up the Committee on Christian Literature for Women and Children, and introduced the idea of interdenominational study books.

In addition they raised two million dollars to which was added another million from the Laura Spelman Rockefeller Fund for Christian colleges in the Orient.

Bishop Will Preach Here Sunday

Bishop A. Raymond Grant, resident bishop of the Portland area of the Methodist Church, will occupy the pulpit of the First Methodist Church Sunday, Feb. 12, at 11 a.m. Long a leader in the Methodist Church, Bishop Grant prior to his election to the episcopacy enjoyed pastorates in the Midwest, and served a ministry in the Sacramento.

Since 1952 Bishop Grant has administered the Portland area, the largest geographically in Methodism, during a period of maximum expansion. Noted for his social awareness and sensitivity to the total gospel, he was recently elected by the Commission on Social Concerns to chair the important Division of Human Relations and Economic Affairs.

Responsible for research and church activity in race relations, civil liberties, separation of church and state, technological change, agriculture and housing and conservation he heads the thrust of Methodism's interest in these vital spheres.
