

Little Gaelic Singers Are Featured At Community Concert

As enchanting as the legendary leprechauns that frolic over the green hills of their native Ireland, the Little Gaelic Singers have returned to present in song and dance the magic of the Emerald Isle. Following their highly successful introduction to the United States in 1956, these radiant youngsters returned for second and third solidly booked tours that carried them across the North American continent. This season's tour will be their fourth of the U.S.A. and Canada.

The appeal of these young singers and dancers is immediate, even to persons who do not have a drop of Irish blood in their veins. Last season they won the hearts of audiences in such cosmopolitan cities as New York, Chicago, Washington, Boston, Detroit, St. Louis, and as far west as Los Angeles and Vancouver. They were invited to appear on Ed Sullivan's television show and scored such a hit that they were immediately re-engaged for two more appearances before they returned home. Their current tour, which ranges from the East Coast to the Middle West, will include another performance on this popular TV program.

The reasons for their appeal are not hard to find. The chorus is made up of 21 girls and three boys, whose clear, fresh voices have been trained to perfection by Director James McCafferty. A consistent winner at the "Feiseanna," the celebrated Irish singing competitions, the group is recognized as one of the finest musical ensembles ever to come out of that traditionally musical land. During the past five years these charming youngsters have won every first prize available to them.

All of the children play musical instruments and dance as well as sing. One of the high spots of the performance is to see and to hear them accompany their joyous songs and sprightly dances with their own violin playing. The program is also enlivened by the dances created by Brandon De Glin, dance director of the organization. De Glin is one of Ireland's most famous dance performers, teachers, judges and creators. His academy in Derry has won over 150 dance championships.

In addition, there is the outstanding young Irish baritone, Austin Gaffney, who sings both solo and concerted numbers. Many rare effects are achieved through the blending of his rich adult voice and the fresh clear tones of the young choristers. Gaffney was born in Dublin. He began the study of music as a boy soprano in the Palestrina Choir at the Pro Cathedral. At the age of 18 he commenced training at the Royal Irish Academy of Music under the direction of Michael O'Higgins. By 1952 he had won all the major vocal competitions at Ireland's most important musical festival, the Feis Ceoil, including the Plunket Greene Cup, the Lieder Prize and the Dramatic Cup, and was granted the special Harold White Prize as the most promising competitor at the 1952 festival.

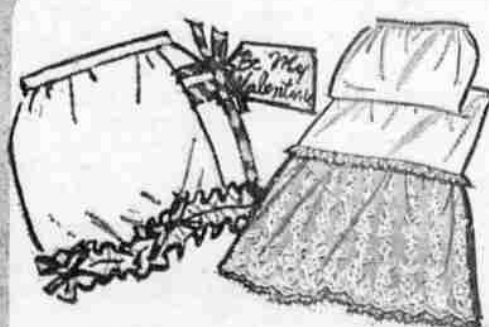
