Phair Brothers Return After Missions Abroad

Twin sons, Larry and Gary, 20, of Mr. and Mrs. Ron Phair, this city, have returned home after long missions abroad for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. They have been in the service of the church for two and a half years, and future plans include the National Guard for six months and two more years of schooling at Brigham Young University in Utah.

Larry was in Belgium and France where LDS missionary work has been developed for 65 years, first in Belgium about 1800 when the first church was established.

He found the people receptive to the teachings of the church and the people friendly toward the United States in both countries. He also found some leanings toward communism, especially in France. There are two LDS temples in Europe, one in London and the second in Berne, Switzerland. Records show there have been over 10,000 LDS baptisms in European countries, since the church was established.

Gary's missionary work was in Uruguay where the 12-year-old mission field also includes parts of Paraguay and Argentina. As in Europe, interest in the church is represented by growing rapidly and in the mission he visited there were 3,500 members.

He found a large church and chapel building program is underway under supervision of the mission president with the central office in Montevideo.

There, too, people were friendly

to the United States in general although there was some hostility at the national level, not against the missionaries. There are 120 located in that part of South America.

Gary and other missionaries helped introduce baseball to the people of the mission, one of the efforts directed toward breaking down prejudice toward this country. He also traveled with musical shows sponsored by the church, playing to large audiences.

The brothers flew to Brussels to meet a younger brother, Ron Phair Jr., now on a mission in Germany with headquarters at Bremen. They saw parts of France, Switzerland and Germany before flying back to the U.S.

E. F. Bananger In Celebration

Maurine Says New Mill, Park Compatible

SALEM (AP) — Sen. Maurine Neuberger, D-Ore., said in a telegram received here Friday she did not think an International Paper Co. mill near Gardiner would bar an Oregon Dunes National Park.

Mrs. Neuberger sent the message to Chairman Norman Howard, D-Portland, of the Oregon House of Representatives State and Federal Affairs Committee.

"I have been asked to comment as to whether establishment of pulp mill operations in the Gardiner area, which would be implemented by legislation now before your committee, is compatible with the proposed Oregon Dunes National Seashore Area," she said.

Mrs. Neuberger said she regretted not having the facts to make a judgment, but said she felt it would not bar the park if proper safeguards were taken.

"The matter before you does not necessarily pose an either-or decision," she said. "With proper safeguards industry and recreation can benefit from joint use of resources."

"Our objective should be to make certain that the safeguards are indeed safe."

International Paper has asked permission of the legislature to run a waste pipe out to sea and to raise the level of Siletos and Tahkennitch lakes.

SALEM (AP) — The state Land Board has decided to give up its rights to obtain potential industrial land in the McNary Dam area in favor of getting additional federal timberlands for the state.

Previously, the board had directed the state Forestry Department to select 7,300 acres for state use.
