

Owls Seek Revenge Over Mounts

Coach Wally Palmberg's Oregon Tech Owl basketball team is within reach of a tie for the number one spot on the Oregon Collegiate Conference. But it's not an easy reach.

Tonight at 8 o'clock on the Mile High hardwood, the Owls come up against the league leading Eastern Oregon College Mountaineers for the first round of their final two game pairings.

The Mounties, 8-2 in OCC action, handed the Tech squad a brace of losses when the Owls invaded La Grande earlier in the season.

The Techmen, 6-4, were shaded 82-78 in a bitter overtime the first night and took a 73-64 thumping the second.

Klamath Falls basketball fans get their first look at two of the top scorers in the Northwest to-

night when Larry Applegate and Tom Neel of EOC square off against Leon Wilson and Hewlett Nash, their opposite numbers on the Owl roster.

Applegate, second only to Gonzaga's great Frank Burgess in point production, boasts a 20.7 point per game season average for 22 times out. His total is 45 to date. Neel, number seven among the top 10, claims a 15.1

average with 332 points over the 22-game distance.

How they fare tonight against Wilson and Nash may be the key to the outcome of the game.

The Owls, however, don't necessarily have to take a back seat in the point production. Wilson leads the Techmen with a total of 283 points and he missed a couple of games; Sammy Smith, who didn't even join the team until almost the midway point, is next with 271 points, and big Bob Petersen is next with 239.

Back in town, on the Academy floor, the SHA Jayvees will host the KU Loggers, the number two freshman team. The game will follow a preliminary featuring the SHA sixth graders versus a sixth grade club from Mills School.

With only one game remaining for most of the teams in the following this weekend's action, there is no chance for the Panthers to be knocked out of the league title.

Just winning the race over the regular schedule doesn't mean much in the B league, however. The teams, plus the Paisley Broncos, will gather at Oregon

on Feb. 23-24-25 for the annual B tournament which will decide the team to represent the area in the State B playoff action.

Until the tourney is over, and the champion crowned, no one team can say it's "in."

In many past years, the league champ and the tourney champ have not been the same team.

Saturday night there are no league games scheduled, but the Merrill squad faces the Tulelake squad at Merrill.

Henley, Lakeview In Valley Actions

The league-leading Henley Hornets and runner-up Lakeview Hornets headed across the Green Springs today for a two-day stand during which they will tangle with the tied-for-third teams, Illinois Valley and Phoenix.

Tonight, the Hornets (6-1) match talents with the Illinois Valley Cougars while Lakeview goes up against the Phoenix five, Saturday

night they swap towns and opponents.

Eagle Point and Rogue River, the bottom men on the Rogue League pole, will meet at Rogue River tonight in the other game.

The trip marks the conclusion of competition with the west clubs, but the Hornets and the Honkers have to meet each other one more time. The Henley crew will travel to Lakeview on Feb. 24 after tangle with the Bonanza Antlers next weekend.

The Lakeview five will play host to the Klamath Union Sox next weekend while awaiting the Hornet invasion.

The Lakeview engers floor one of the most well-balanced teams in the league according to statistics released by coach Ted McKee. Their top producer, Doug Maxwell, carries a 9.8 average while the number two man, Larry Peters, packs an 8.7. Troy McCoy is next with an 8.3 and Gary Reynolds follows with a 7.9 average. Garry Peters rounds out the first five with a 6.8 per while Chuck Cossey is next with 4.9. The Honkers have averaged 33.7 points per game while allowing their opponents an average of 45.6. For the overall season the Lakeview squad, in its first season as a member of the Rogue League, has a 12-won, 4-lost record.

Chief Flash Scores 30 In Victory

PORTLAND (AP) — Eddie Miles led Seattle University back to victory Thursday night with a come-from-behind 61-60 decision over the University of Portland.

Miles, who scored 30 points, provided the winning margin in the closing seconds.

The score was tied at 50-50 and 1:45 minutes remained when 6-10 Bill Garner of Portland put his team in front with a free throw.

Back came the 6-4 Miles, driving for the basket. He made the lay-in as he was fouled by Garner. He dropped in the free throw too, and Seattle was in front 61-59.

After that Portland could add only a free throw by Garner.

It was Seattle's fourth straight victory over Portland this season, and got Seattle back to victory after losing two games east of the Cascades, to Idaho and Washington State.

Portland took a 37-31 halftime lead and had the margin up to 47-37 before Miles led the closing rally.

Garner and guard Mike Doherty led Portland with 15 points each.

Owl Matmen Travel To Chico; KUHS Wrestlers Home, Away Set To Go

Road trips figure into both the Klamath Union Pelican and Oregon Tech Owls weekend wrestling plans.

The Techmen, claiming a 3-1 season mark to date, climb into their cars for a trip to Chico Saturday where they will tangle with the C-Staters after the varsity basketball game Saturday night. The match is the final dual test facing the Owls prior to their entrance in the Oregon Collegiate Conference tournament next week.

The Pelicans, undefeated in 10 starts this year, come to grips with the most powerful team, outside of the KU squad itself, in the conference tonight at 7 o'clock in Pelican Court.

The Grants Pass Caverners are here looking for vengeance of an earlier 24-21 defeat handed by the Pel grapplers.

When the KU club finishes with the Cavers they'll take an overnight rest, then head for Prineville for a rematch with the Cowboys. The Prineville squad

holds no terrors for the Pels, but a much closer bout is expected. The first time the two teams met it was on Pelican mats and the local squad racked up a 33-9 triumph. This, however, was the first match of the season for both and coach DeLance Duncan figures that the experience the Cowboys have gained over the season will have aided them materially.
