Duck Hunters Are Warned Of Fowl Slump

WASHINGTON (AP)—The nation's duck hunters, particularly those in the mid-continent, were warned Friday their bags may be unusually poor this fall.

North America's waterfowl resources will be in the "most precarious position in the past three decades" unless there are unusual snows and above normal rains the next three months to help the nesting season, the Interior Department reported.

Heavy precipitation is needed in the northern United States and Southern Canada between now and the middle of May, a spokesman said. Up to 55 per cent of the continent's waterfowl crop comes from that area.

The main moisture deficiency is in Saskatchewan but Alberta and Manitoba are also unusually dry for this time of year, the department said.

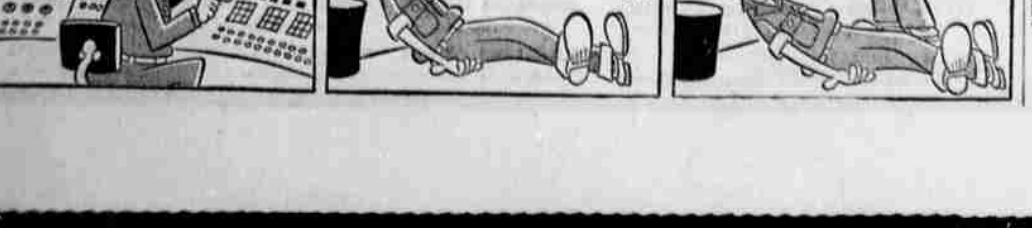
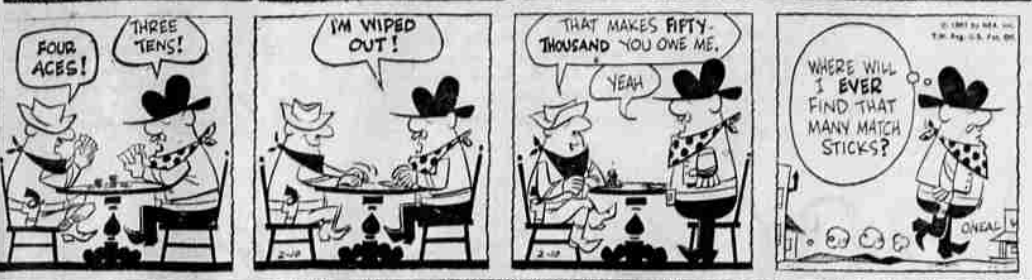
