FPC Examiner Brands Request As 'Scandalous'

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Federal Power Commission examiner Thursday branded as scandalous a request by the Washington Public Power Supply System to subpoena two commission officials for questioning about alleged bias in staff testimony.

Examiner William C. Levy said he considered the request "highly scandalous, frivolous and improper at this point." He made his remark in denying the application for subpoenas and in calling for the first FPC staff witness to take the stand.

Mrs. Evelyn N. Cooper, counsel for WPPSS, made the request prior to cross-examination of staff witnesses in a hearing on competing applications for dam licenses on the middle Snake River.

WPPSS seeks a license to build the Nez Perce hydro-electric project on the river between Idaho and Oregon. Pacific Northwest Power Co. wants to build the nearby High Mountain Sheep project.

"WPPSS submits that the positions taken by the staff witnesses (in prepared testimony) are so plainly and arbitrarily biased as to make it readily apparent that they are not the product of independent analysis and judgment," the application for subpoenas said.

To probe alleged improprieties in direction and preparation of staff testimony, WPPSS asked subpoenas for Francis L. Adams, FPC power bureau chief, and Leisher S. Wing, regional engineer at San Francisco.

IN DAD'S SHOES

CARSON CITY, Nev. (UPI)—Richard Christensen, 14, of Sparks, Nev., got a chance to fill his father's shoes Thursday.

He was one of 132 Nevada Boy Scouts who took over the reins of state government for a day, was assigned to sit as speaker of the assembly, a post his father holds at the current session of the legislature.

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In its request, opposed by counsel for PNP and the staff, WPPSS also asked for certain documents relating to preparation of testimony.

"The real source of the prejudice can only be reached through an examination of Wing, the im-

mediate superior of the staff's technical witnesses, and of his superior, Adams," the application said.

In denying the request, Levy said it is in substance a renewal of a similar application by WPPSS last October which was denied.

Hugh Smith, PNP counsel, said the application was "plowing old ground," and a "renewed attempt to discredit the testimony" of staff witnesses.

He added he might consider it differently if filed after staff witnesses have been heard.

Both Sander and Smith contended that alleged bias can be explored through cross-examination of witnesses.

Levy ordered Jack M. Shepley, a technical FPC witness, to take the stand for cross-examination.

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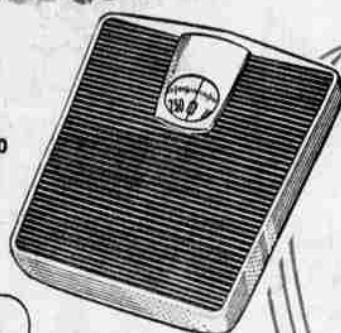
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
