

Digger Provides Opportunity To Study Soil

ALTURAS — A 300-mile slice through California, being made by a giant trench digger cutting an eight-foot-deep ditch from the Oregon border to Antioch by the Pacific Gas and Electric Company, will give soil scientists of the University of California an opportunity to study subsurface soil conditions.

The great trench is part of a final link in a 38-inch underground pipeline which will bring natural gas from Alberta, Canada, to the San Francisco Bay Area.

Frank H. Harradine of the Department of Soil and Plant Nutrition, said, "This is what a geologist or soil scientist dreams about—a fresh cut in the earth's surface, deep enough and long enough to give an uninterrupted picture of the subsurface pattern across a large area."

Harradine, together with soil scientists Kenneth D. Gowan and Eugene L. Begg, is planning to make periodic observations along the excavation in conjunction with other soil investigations in Northern California.

As the big ditch is cut across the high Modoc plateau, much of which never has been sampled even with conventional soil survey techniques, scientists expect to observe in detail how contrasting soil types merge with one another.

Such information is difficult to obtain with conventional auger boring, Harradine said. This study will provide data which can be applied to practical soil problems in agriculture and highway construction.

Since the trench will pass from a 6,000-foot elevation to near sea level through a vast number of soil conditions it will afford a greater than usual depth for observations to soil surveyors.

The varied climates and vegetation patterns through which the excavation will be made will be ideal for studying the interplay of the basic soil forming factors such as climate, vegetation, topography, parent material, and time.

The study is planned to be completed in about a year.
