Accused Killer Enters Guilty Plea At Eugene

EUGENE (AP)—Robert Evans, 45, Crawfordville, has pleaded guilty to a charge of second degree murder in the slaying of Everett Leslie Fletcher, 52, of Junction City last Dec. 26. Evans also has been accused of killing a police officer.

Evans entered the plea after Dist. Atty. William Frye moved that a first degree murder indictment be reduced to second degree.

Oregon statutes provide a mandatory life sentence for second degree murder.

Evans is also accused of the shotgun killing of Junction City Police Chief Woodrow Whetstone. He had been scheduled to go to trial Feb. 20 on a first degree murder indictment in connection with Whetstone's death. He will not be tried on this charge, however, unless he initiates legal steps asking for the trial.

Judge Fort also granted a motion by Frye to reduce a third charge from assault with intent to kill to assault with a dangerous weapon and Evans entered a guilty plea. This involves the wounding of Mrs. Verna Mae Milligan, 42, Eugene, at the same time Fletcher and Whetstone were killed.

Police said Evans was a rejected suitor and that Mrs. Milligan and Fletcher had called for help after being threatened. When the police chief arrived at her home, Evans fired several shotgun blasts, killing Fletcher and Whetstone and wounding Mrs. Milligan.

Aid Assured
WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Wayne Morse, D-Ore., said Friday he has been assured by the White House that if the food stamp plan of aid to the needy is expanded, three Oregon areas will be considered.

Morse recently urged President Kennedy to consider Portland (Multnomah County), Roseburg or Grants Pass as test areas for the food stamp program.

Larry O'Brien, special assistant to the President, wrote Morse that limited funds available for the program made it necessary to restrict areas for pilot projects. "I am, however," O'Brien said, "suggesting to the secretary of agriculture that if additional projects are to be initiated that every

Men At Bottom Are Susceptible

CHICAGO (AP)—A three-year study of heart attacks among a wide range of personnel in a large industrial operation challenges the common belief that men at the top have the most to fear.

Actually, the worker down to the bottom of the income scale is the most likely prey for heart trouble, say doctors Sidney Pell and C. A. D'Alonzo of Wilmington, Del.

In the current issue of the Journal of the American Medical Association, released today, they report the findings of a study covering 99,000 employees of E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Co. The year were off 1.36 per cent from the similar period of 1959.

Rare Bone Transplant Is Success

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP)—An unusual transplant of bone marrow from one identical twin to another to combat a rare disease was reported a success Friday.

The patient is Nancy Lowry, 7, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Lowry, Tacoma, Wash. She had a bone marrow disease.

Nancy's twin, Barbara, underwent 50 needle punctures of her lower legs and pelvic bones so doctors could withdraw about a tablespoon full of bone marrow.

The marrow, in a salt solution, was dropped gradually into Nancy's bloodstream, as in a blood transfusion. Doctors say the marrow found its way to the bone spaces.

Nancy had aplastic anemia, in which the bone marrow is unable to form normal cells.

The doctors say they do not know whether the marrow from the healthy twin replaced Nancy's

It now has been several months since the transplant.

"As far as we can tell," said a doctor who declined use of his name, "Nancy's bone marrow is working normally. We expect that it will continue to do so."

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
