

California Unemployment Hits Decade Record

SACRAMENTO (UPI)—California unemployment during January reached its "highest point in a decade" when the number of jobless persons in the state totaled 517,000.

Employment Director Irving Perluss said Thursday night the January unemployment total of eight per cent of the labor force, 65,000 more jobs than during last December when unemployment rose to 6.9 per cent.

The new figures also are 148,000 more unemployed than January a year ago when unemployment was 5.9 per cent of all the state's workers.

Almost simultaneously, Gov. Edmund G. Brown released a recession report on 13 "representative counties" of the state and sent a wire to President John F. Kennedy reporting on California's attempts to alleviate the recession.

"I am greatly encouraged, despite our steadily rising unemployment, to know that your administration is fully alert to the nation's economic problems and is moving with vigor to strengthen the economy," he said.

"California is moving ahead in partnership with your administration to accelerate projects that will provide new jobs and invigorate business," he reported.

Brown said the state's \$38 million share of federal highway aid was being put out to bid at the rate of \$35-\$40 million monthly compared to the normal rate of \$28 million.

The report on the 13 counties, submitted to Brown by State Social Welfare Director John M. Wedemeyer, said unemployment in some of them "is the worst since the depression of the 1930s."

Wedemeyer told Brown the findings were compiled from the reports of crews of investigators in Los Angeles, San Diego, Alameda, Santa Clara, Contra Costa, San Joaquin, Marin, Humboldt, Mendocino, Riverside, Kern, Stanislaus, Fresno and Shasta Counties.

Late Payers Face Penalty

A five per cent penalty will be assessed this year on taxpayers who do not file a personal property return by the March 3 deadline, Ray Brackman, deputy county assessor, said Friday morning.

Personal property returns must be filed by all persons and companies engaged in commercial enterprises. The returns are used by the assessor's office to compute the assessment roll.

"We have been lenient in past years," Brackman said, "but this year we will apply penalties under the law."

In the event no return is filed by March 3, the assessor's office has the right to make an arbitrary assessment of property, using the "best available information."

Notices were mailed Friday morning to taxpayers who have not yet filed their returns.

The charm of childhood, the beautifully trained voices of the Little Gaelic Singers and of baritone soloist Austin Gaffney, the repertoire, and the costuming captivated the Community Concert Association audience at Mills School Thursday night and brought rounds upon rounds of applause.

The versatile performers brought a bit of their homeland with them, a reminder of the stormy waves of Galway Bay, the deep green of the Lakes of Killarney, the thatched cottages of County Down and County Kerry.

The 21 girls and three boys have heartwarming appeal. All of the children, now on the fourth American tour, play musical instruments and dance as well as sing. Several of their spritely dance numbers were enlivened by music of the talented small violinists.

For their concert appearance the girls wore Irish green dresses emblazoned with the Celtic Cross and the mystical Round Tower. Their red-lined capes were embroidered with the gold harp of Ireland. The boys wore the traditional kilts of Royal Saffron.

They came from Londonderry, expertly trained by Director James McCafferty. During the past five years these young artists have won every first prize available to them, including the famous Irish singing competition, the "Feisanna," where competition is keen.

They sang "Eileen Aroon," with its haunting cadences, Perla Nani Bhrolaigh Bhaun in Celtic with violin accompaniment, the rollicking Irish street ballad, "Cockles and Mussels," a world favorite, and many more on to the final number, the ambitious "Irish Jig" with violinists and the choir.

The lovely "Nora Lee," sung by the choir with baritone Austin Gaffney in the solo part, was well worth the price of the season ticket.

Soloists in the choir were Myra Wilson, Cherie Callan, Deirdre MacCarron, John Carlin and Philip MacCracken. Violinists were Jennifer Gormley, Thomas Haddon and Myra Wilson.

The children travel by bus accompanied by James McCafferty, musical director, Helen Cassidy, accompanist; Birdie MacGuinness, choir supervisor; Brendan J. Carr, dance sequences, and Thomas J. Carr, staging.

The Little Gaelic Singers appeared in the third concert of five, one a bonus, arranged by the association board of directors for the 1960-61 concert season. Two future appearances of artists include Myra Kinch and Company on March 13 and Archer and Gile on April 6.

Audience response to the concert and the attendance attested to the popularity of this type of entertainment brought to Klamath Falls by the concert association.
