Grand Jury Still Studying School Conditions

DUNSMUIR—The 1960 Siskiyou County Grand Jury had no new development to report to the members of the school board at the regular February meeting, concerning the study of safety hazards and inadequacies of the Dunsmuir Elementary School.

This study covers such areas as crowded conditions, unsafe fire escapes, limited playground space and lack of classrooms. This study began following action started by a citizens committee in March 1957, concerning school conditions.

Since the beginning of this study it should be noted that the school board, along with the administration, has taken many steps to reduce unsafe conditions, including the installation of a new automatic fire alarm system.

Roger Ellis, school principal, was commended by Harold Baughman, board member, for his realistic approach in handling the problems concerning the school. Failure of a new school bond issue in recent years has brought about the necessity to improve on what is at hand, commented Baughman.

Progress on the reduction of fire hazard was brought out during

a recent inspection by the state fire marshal. Further action to reduce fire hazard include the installation of an alarm system in the auditorium and removal of a frame building to reduce fire danger. Further studies are being conducted to combat fire hazard. Other business discussed at the meeting included the opening date for next year's term, Sept. 5.
