B Hoopsters Prep For Tournament

What follows the opener in the annual B County League Basketball Tournament which opens on the Oregon Tech Court Thursday afternoon could be anti-climactic.

The Merrill Huskies and the Bonanza Antlers get the big three-day event underway at 1:30 p.m. The tourney is a single elimination affair scheduling four games the opening day, and following up with two each on Friday and Saturday.

Immediately following the Bonanza-Merrill battle the second place Malin Mustangs will tangle with the Gilchrist Grizzlies. At 7:30 Thursday evening the Sacred Heart Trojans and the Paisley Broncos will play, followed by the nightcap, which features the county champion Chiloquin Panthers versus the Bly Bobcats.

Friday night beginning at 7:30 the winners of the first two games will clash and the winners of the last two Thursday games are scheduled for the wind-up.

Saturday night the Friday winners will meet for the tournament championship and the right to represent the county in the quest for a state B championship. A preliminary game Saturday night will match the Friday losers in a tiff to decide third and fourth place.

At the conclusion of the Saturday game a Tournament All-Star team picked by the participating coaches will be announced. In addition to the tournament championship trophy to be presented the winner, the Chiloquin squad will be awarded the B league title cup for its win over regular season action.

Also to be awarded are the tourney runnerup trophy, the game ball to the team winning third place, and the sportsmanship trophy.

The tournament will be directed by Jim Conroy, the Malin High School principal, who will perform in the absence of Howard Bingham, the director of the B school athletics.

Going into the action the Huskies and the Antlers are rated a toss-up and figure as equal sharers of the tourney favorite role with Malin and Chiloquin.

The Sacred Heart Trojans, the Paisley Broncos, and the Bly Bobcats are rated the tourney underdogs, but, over seasons past pre-tourney picks have not always gone the route charted for them.

Chiloquin ended the season on top of the league but the second place Mustangs knocked them from the unbeaten ranks in the

The Los Angeles Lakers are out of the running for the Western Division title in the National Basketball Association.

The Lakers visited Morgantown Monday night to play the Syracuse Nationals, lost 126-121 and the St. Louis Hawks backed into the Western title.

The Lakers' Elgin Baylor scored 45 points and grabbed 21 rebounds while veteran Dolph Schayes, playing his 639th consecutive NBA game, was the big man for Syracuse with 29 points.

Los Angeles, a half game ahead of the Detroit Pistons, plays Syracuse in the first half of a New York doubleheader tonight. The New York Knicks meet the Philadelphia Warriors in the other game. The Cincinnati Royals, only a game and a half behind the Lakers, play at St. Louis in tonight's other NBA game.
