Dunsmuir Chamber Votes Brochure

DUNSMUIR — Preparation of a layout and copy for 20,000 promotion brochures was authorized at a special meeting of the board of directors of the Dunsmuir Chamber of Commerce on Monday morning. Another special meeting will be held sometime this week to approve the completely revised brochure.

Weed Lions Plan Sale

WEED — Members of Weed Lions Club plan soon to package light bulbs for their forthcoming money-raising bulb sale.

The theme of the sale is "To Light the Way for Community Betterment." Lions will conduct a house-to-house sale Feb. 24 and 25.

Proceeds will be applied to the Lions community betterment program.

Advertising space will be solicited and the brochures printed within the next two weeks, Les Lenton, president, assured those present.

Eagles Wanted

MOUNT SHASTA—Kenneth Lening, secretary of Mount Shasta Eagles Aerie No. 342, has announced that the lodge will make a membership drive through March, April and May. Initiation fees will be cut to \$5 during that time. Reinstatement costs will also be lessened to bring up the membership.

Enlargement of the chamber board to include presidents of the communities, service and civic clubs was approved and invitations will be issued by the chamber secretary.

Invitations will also be sent to Southern Pacific officials in Dunsmuir and union representatives to hear a representative of Santa Fe railroad discuss Santa Fe's proposal to merge with Western Pacific. This dinner meeting of the chamber will be March 8 at the Travelers Hotel.

A motion was passed that a chamber of commerce letter be written to a Redding newspaper asking for more objective coverage of Dunsmuir's problems in the future. It was felt a recent article of school deficiencies presented a distorted picture.

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Siskiyou Sheriff To Head Drive

YREKA—At a meeting of the head the 1961 Red Cross fund-raising drive in Siskiyou County last week, Siskiyou County Sheriff A. B. Cottar was chosen to head the drive. Charles Cooley, treasurer of the Siskiyou County Chapter, stated that responsibility of the people and the Red Cross was a major point for discussion at the Redding meeting.

Labor Election Bill In House

SALEM (AP) Legislation to provide for state-conducted elections to permit employees to decide on bargaining agents was passed by the Senate today and sent to the House. There was only one dissenting vote.

The bill would create a state Labor-Management Relations Board of three members, who would be appointed by the governor. When an employer, employee or labor union asked the board for an election, the board would have the attorney general investigate. Then the board could order the state labor conciliator to conduct the election.

The bill had the strong support of employer groups. The Oregon AFL-CIO said the bill is unnecessary, but did not oppose it.

Charles O'Donnell of Yreka is executive secretary of the Siskiyou County chapter.

Plans for the coming campaign were outlined at a meeting of the local chapter, called by Cottar at Yreka Inn Tuesday. Cooley stated some of the funds collected in this area will be sent to the National Red Cross organization for relief of disaster areas. He pointed out that in 1955, Siskiyou County received more than \$100,000 in Red Cross aid for Klamath River floods.

New Loan Rulings Told

YREKA—Farmers may obtain operating and development loans from their farms and from taking the Farmer's Home Administration under revised regulations with this agency if they have off-the-farm employment and are otherwise eligible.

Previously a farmer had to spend most of his time farming in order to qualify for a loan, according to James F. Walker, Farm Home Administration supervisor.

Many farmers who are regularly employed off the farm can profitably use FHA's credit facilities to increase the farm portion of their total income. The regulation, which had limited credit assistance to farmers who spend most of their time farming, prevented some from obtaining the maximum income from their farms and from taking advantage of opportunities for the industry and other off-farm employment.

Resolution Asks For Defense Work

SALEM (AP) — The House Tuesday unanimously approved a Senate-passed resolution that urges the federal government to give Oregon its fair share of defense contracts.

Rep. George Flitcraft, R-Klamath Falls, said that Oregon now gets far less than its share. The resolution will be sent to Congress and the secretary of Defense.

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
