### Army Gives Grocery Bag Training

WASHINGTON (AP)—Detailed instructions to soldiers on how to stuff a grocery bag have touched off another round in Rep. Frank Kowalski's battle with military brass. Kowalski, a retired colonel, threw his latest punch at the grocery bags soldiers are packing at the Army's Ft. Monmouth, N. J., communications center. The Connecticut Democrat said he was shocked to learn GI baggers got page-long training instructions. He asked Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara to share his shock that men trained to soldier were being coached in grocery bagging. The nation "can afford a grocery bag bag more than a missile bag," Kowalski said. Peter Hoffman, information of-

ficer at Ft. Monmouth, said civilians could not be hired to do the job because of budget and manpower ceilings. And he added the memos were discontinued last September. Among the things soldier baggers were instructed to do were: 1. Use extra care with wet vegetables, frozen foods and ice cream.

2. Use small items such as candy and cigarettes to fill empty spaces. 3. Put the cash register receipt in the bag, hand the bag to the customer—making sure she has a firm hold on it—smile, and say pleasantly, "Thank you."

### University Interviews Candidate

EUGENE (AP) — Fred H. Harrington, vice president of academic affairs at the University of Wisconsin, visited Eugene Monday, presumably to discuss the University of Oregon presidency. John R. Richards, chancellor of

the state system of higher education, said Tuesday he was not at liberty to disclose any details of Harrington's visit. Henry F. Cabell, president of the Board of Higher Education, indicated that Harrington was to

be interviewed by the board in Portland Tuesday afternoon. The Board of Higher Education has been seeking a new president for the University of Oregon since O. Meredith Wilson went to the University of Minnesota last July. Names previously mentioned included George Waggoner, dean of the college of liberal arts and sciences at the University of Kansas, and Arthur S. Flemming, who was secretary of Health, Education and Welfare in the Eisenhower cabinet.
