Food Stamp Plan Facing Big Delay

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Kennedy's food stamp plan for feeding needy Americans in six distressed areas, announced three weeks ago, isn't off the ground yet. It may be two months more before anybody actually gets any free food under the program.

The first step toward putting the program into operation may come very soon, Agriculture Department experts said. This will be a decision by Agriculture Secretary Orville L. Freeman on what type or types of food stamp plans will be tested, and in what localities the tests will be made.

Agriculture Department officials then will begin conferences with local and state officials and with officials of grocery trade groups to prepare for their role of cashing and redeeming food stamps. An order also will have to be issued for printing the stamps, a job which Agriculture Department officials have been told will take about two months.

Kenney's announcement that the experiments would be launched in areas of West Virginia, Pennsylvania, southern Illinois, eastern Kentucky, northern Minnesota and in Detroit caught Agriculture Department officials by surprise.

They had not expected the presidential action so quickly, and in three weeks they have not settled a number of potential legal problems involved in the program.

The knottiest problem is the question of just what kind of action Congress authorized in a 1959 law which permits the administration to operate a food stamp program through January, 1962.

Agriculture Department officials have indicated informally they are planning on programs in which needy families would use stamps to buy a wide range of foods, including meats, fruits, and vegetables, at grocery stores.

But some congressional attorneys who have studied the law believe that such programs might be stretching the language of the Food Stamp Act.

Alturas Beef Production Gains Over Last Year

ALTURAS — Figures released this week by the California Cattlemen's Association show some gain in beef production for this area.

Cattle and calves on feed in California feedlots Feb. 1 totaled 671,000 head, or six per cent less than the number on feed a month ago, but 15 per cent more than a year ago.

Marketings of fed cattle during January totaled 158,000 head. This compares with 153,000 in December, and 146,000 marketed during January, 1960.

Cattle placed on feed during January totaled 117,000 head—unchanged from the number placed on feed in December and 32,000 head more than January, 1960.

Feedlots in Arizona had 292,000 head on feed Feb. 1, 8,000 less than on feed a month ago.
