**Victims Were Relatives Of Local Man**

WEED — Gordon Willard Ring, 44, and his son Dennis, 7, of Grants Pass, who were killed in an auto accident near here Tuesday afternoon, were the brother and nephew, respectively, of Henry (Hank) Ring, owner-operator of Ring Sheet Metal in Klamath Falls and an officer of the Klamath Basin Roundup Association.

**Nurses Support Hospital Bill**

SALEM (AP) — Nurses supporting a bill to make hospitals bargain with them over working conditions aired their grievances Tuesday at a hearing before the House Labor and Industries Committee.

Don Eva, Portland, a lawyer for the Oregon Nursing Association, said "the nurses just want dignity — recognition."

But James G. Swindells, Portland, a lawyer for the Oregon Hospital Association, said the hospitals could settle their differences with the nurses without passage of a law.

Clarice Cox, a Prineville nurse, said a hospital fired her because she encouraged overworked nurses to file grievances.

Mrs. Muriel Davis, supervisor in the Portland City Health Department, said the bill would aid in recruiting nurses.

The victim's wife, Hilda, was listed in serious but not critical condition in Mount Shasta Community Hospital Thursday morning.

Two others injured, Mrs. Helen Frances Nicodemus, 33, and Oliver Fredrick Fredricksen, 51, both of Dunsmuir, also were said to be in serious condition but not on the critical list there. All suffered broken bones in the head-on collision just south of here. Witnesses stated they believe

Ring's car plunged 50 feet over an embankment, officers said. The boy was thrown out and Ring was pinned under the auto, they stated.

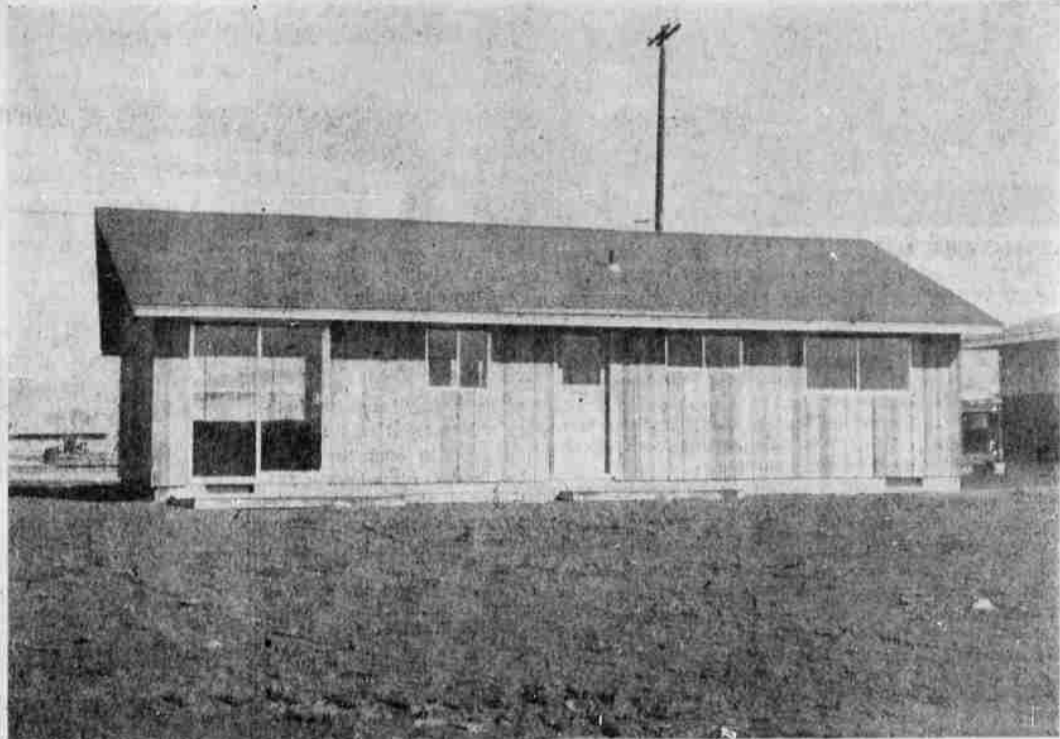
Fredricksen was a passenger in the Nicodemus car.

The bodies were taken to Upton's Mortuary in Weed, then transported to Stockton. Members of Ring's family there made funeral arrangements.

Ring was born Sept. 29, 1916, in South Dakota. He was a machinist.

Prior to his short residency in Grants Pass, he lived in the Stockton area about 15 years.
