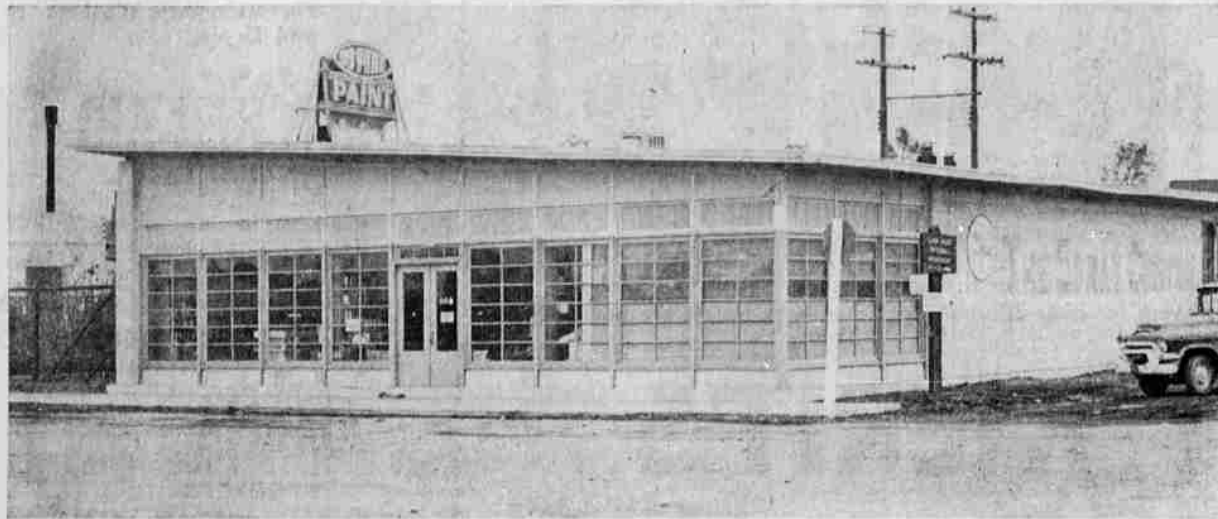

PLANT LIFE . . .

Woody stems, waterproof leaves, matted roots, deep roots, "tolerance" to chemicals.

SOILS . . .

Hard-packed or tight soils, presence of unusual elements, leaching in sandy soils, mineral content, depth of topsoil, carbon overlay, fill-dirt, sawdust.

Extreme or unknown conditions, whether man-made or natural.

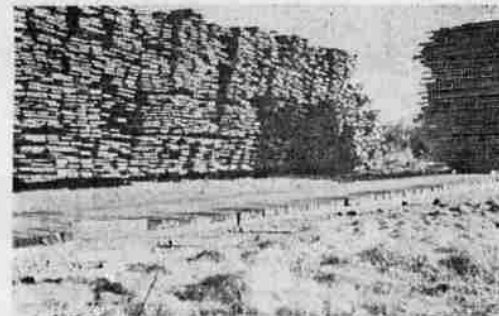
MOISTURE . . .

HUMAN ELEMENT . . .

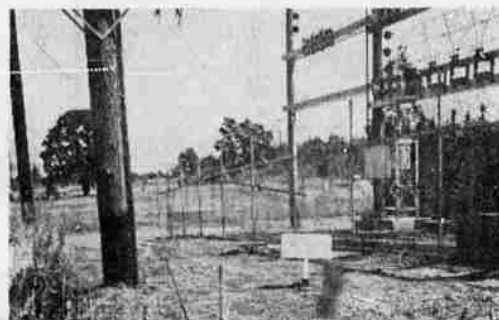
Experience and ability of operator determines evenness of application . . . what to use, timing, dosage.
