## Two Die In Fort Lewis Plane Crash

FT. LEWIS, Wash. (AP)—Two military men were killed Sunday when two light planes collided over the Ft. Lewis military reservation.

The victims, both occupants of one of the planes, were Sgt. Robert Modrow, 39, Tullicum, Wash., and 1st Lt. Enrique Mata, 27, El Paso, Tex.

Ft. Lewis authorities said two men in the second plane managed to land safely and escaped injury. They were identified as Lt. Col. E. L. Lewis, a doctor, and 2nd Lt. Eric Lorenzen.

After the collision, Lewis radioed for a helicopter and when his own plane made it safely down boarded the 'copter and flew to the crash scene to offer his services.

Lewis told investigators he was coming in for a landing about three miles from an airport and was about 1,100 feet up, going 110 miles an hour when the plane collided with one ascending after takeoff. Lewis said he tried to turn to avoid the plane but the left wing of the craft hit the side of his plane.

## Salem Four Wins Title

FOREST GROVE, Ore. (AP)—The mellow tones of the Capitol Chordsmen of Salem earned them 400 silver dollars here Saturday night as they won the championship at the All-Northwest Barber-shop Ballad Contest.

The Chordsmen ended the regular competition in a tie with the Four-Do-Matics of Seattle, but took the top prize in a sing-off with their rendition of "The Girl That I Marry." The Four-Do-Matics got \$250 for their second place finish. The Gem Dandies of Boise, Idaho, the defending champions, finished third.

The singing was the highlight of this city's annual Gay Nineties Festival. Things weren't so gay, though, for the big parade Saturday. Drenching rain, mixed with snow, fell as the parade got underway. A number of marching units refused to march. The spectators that stuck around watched mostly from doorways.

## Girl Tries To See Kennedy

GREENEVILLE, Tenn. (AP)—A girl who wanted to see President Kennedy saved \$20 from her school lunch allowance and went to the White House.

Shortly after daylight Sunday, White House guards said Kay Eichenberry, 14, of Greeneville, appeared at the gates and asked to see the President.

When the guard said the President wasn't at home, Kay said she would wait. The guard called police, who located the runaway girl on a nearby park bench and persuaded her to help them contact her parents.

Kay's parents, Mr. and Mrs. L. J. Eichenberry, said she told them she was going to the library to return some books, then boarded a bus for the nation's capital.

Kay's father, a Magnavox Co. executive, told neighbors before he and Mrs. Eichenberry left by plane for Washington that he would try to arrange for Kay to see the President before they return home.

## Police Press Search For Child Killer

NEW YORK (UPI)—Police today sought a toothless, drunken degenerate believed to be the slayer of 4-year-old Edith (Googie) Kiecorius whose disrobbed and battered body was found Sunday in a slum room.

Some 20,000 face sketches and a nationwide alarm were issued for the man who rented the \$8-a-week trash-littered room under the name of Fred Thompson. He was described as 5-3 tall, sandy-haired and in his early fifties. He was last seen Wednesday one hour before Googie disappeared.

Acting Chief of Detectives Robert Gallati said, "We feel very encouraged." Police scoured the run-down Manhattan neighborhood with sketches of Thompson in a hunt for acquaintances. One report said persons in two bars identified him and described him as a troublemaker. Police have good fingerprints from more than 40 beer cans that littered his room.

The pretty blonde girl was found by detectives who broke down the door of the rooming house flat after another tenant in the building complained of an odor coming from the room in which Thompson rented Feb. 17, paying in advance.

Googie had been sexually molested and was killed the day she disappeared, the medical examiner said. Her beaten, twisted body was lying on an iron poster bed, partly covered with a sheet and a dark red quilt. Her underwear and purple snowsuit had been ripped off and tossed on the floor, but she still was wearing a green dress.

## Eisenhower Disavows Statements By Mundt

WASHINGTON (AP)—Former President Dwight D. Eisenhower Sunday night disavowed as inaccurate and regrettable a fellow Republican's statement that Eisenhower is critical of the direction President Kennedy's administration is taking.

Sen. Karl E. Mundt, R-S.D., talked with Eisenhower for an hour recently at his Palm Springs, Calif., vacation spot. In a news letter he sends to constituents, Mundt Sunday gave his impression of Eisenhower's views.

"He is critical of the tendencies thus far evidenced by the JFK administration—too much left of center; too partisan; too slanted toward programs supported by union bosses," Mundt wrote.

Minding no words, Eisenhower issued this disavowal through a secretary: "Sen. Mundt's statement as reported to me Sunday evening does not accurately describe either my views on public affairs or my personal plans, and I very much regret its issuance.

"The senator evidently intended to repeat in detail our private and purely social conversation, but his recollection of the many subjects mentioned and his interpretations differ markedly from my own.

"Especially I regret the assessment attributed to me of the performance of my successor and his administration, on which subject I have formed no judgment.

"Moreover, I have always directed my public criticism to ideas and programs—never to individuals. While in that conversation and on prior occasion I have expressed opposition to certain of the pledges in the platform adopted in Los Angeles, I have likewise expressed the earnest hope of every loyal American that the future actions of the new administration will promote the overall welfare of the United States."

Mundt could not be reached Sunday night for comment on Eisenhower's statement.

## Weekend Oregon Accidents Claim Two More Lives

One car dropped from an overpass and another upended on a beach Sunday, and in each accident one person died. Oregon's highway death toll for 1961 thus continued to mount at a rate of one fatality a day.

An accident on the sands of Heceta Beach near Florence took the life Sunday of Glenn Earl Beattie, 21, of Cottage Grove.

Coroner's deputy Joseph Clark said Beattie's car skidded broadside into a log and then pitched through the air, landing on its top. Beattie was pinned beneath the auto and suffered a fatal neck injury.

Three other persons in the car escaped serious injury. They were identified as Kenneth Walker, 17; Kenneth Bennett, 21; and Richard Reddig, 29, all of Cottage Grove.

Inside the glove compartment of Beattie's smashed car, police found a safe driving citation from the Air Force. He had been released from the Air Force in December.

Earlier Sunday, a car skidded on ice, smashed through the railing on an overpass and dropped 25 feet onto a highway near McMinnville. Mrs. Lester B. Robuck of Sheridan was thrown out of the car and killed outright. Police said her husband escaped injury. Oregon's traffic death toll for the year now stands at 57 persons, including 23 in February, in the Associated Press tabulation.

## Tax Package For Business

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The administration is putting together a tax package which—if enacted—would give business more than \$1 billion in tax credits, to encourage investment in new production facilities.

To recover revenues that would be lost under the proposal, the Treasury is giving strong consideration to asking that Congress knock out the present special allowances for income from stock dividends.

No general program of tax reform or relief is scheduled for this year by President Kennedy. Officials feel the legislative calendar is too crowded.

Accordingly, the White House plans to ask only for what it considers "must" tax legislation. Kennedy already has put stimulation of investment in this category.

Administration tax experts lean toward giving business credits for investment rather than allowing more generous tax deductions for depreciation. They said the credit method was more likely to generate extra investment.

The amount of tax savings would depend on how much businessmen take advantage of the plan and what limit, if any, the government puts on it. Treasury tax experts think chances are good it would be worth more than \$1 billion a year to industry.
