ALTURAS — Too much concentration on trying to locate the source of a noise in a customer's car resulted in an accident near here last week for Bruce Nugent, local car dealer, police said.

Nugent, say California Highway Patrol officers, was test-driving a customer's car on the Lakeview Highway about three miles north of Alturas Thursday afternoon when the accident occurred. Ernie Groth, a mechanic in Nugent's employ, was in the back seat of the sedan and both were intent on listening for the complained-of noise, officers said.

According to officers, Nugent made a U-turn on the highway, intending to come back to Alturas, when his car was struck on the right rear side by a car driven by William Davenport of Paradise, Calif. Davenport and his wife both reportedly received minor injuries.

Nugent told CHP officers that he did not see the car driven by Davenport and was unaware that one was approaching until he heard a horn and was hit by the other car, patrolmen stated.

The sedan Nugent was driving sustained major damage to the right rear end, according to officers, and the front of Davenport's car was also damaged.

The CHP has charged Nugent with unsafe movement on the highway.
