WAUKEGAN, Ill. (AP) — The carpocapsa saltitans, according to Webster, is the baby moth that gives the Mexican jumping bean its bounce. The moth, says Waukegan health inspector Chester McMullen, popped from its bean recently and hit a girl, giving her a case of hives. McMullen confiscated all jumping beans from local stores Monday and said he has recommended the City Council prohibit the sale of the bean which, when warmed in the hand, sets the moth lava moving, causing his bean home to tumble about. The girl's hives have disappeared, McMullen said. "It's nothing serious," he added.
