Judge Rules Salem Mall Zoning Ordinance Illegal

PORTLAND (AP)—Salem's city zoning ordinance designed to protect the Capitol Mall from commercial development is unconstitutional, federal District Judge William G. East ruled today. The judge agreed with John D. Robertson, who brought suit, that the ordinance was basically a prelude to the state taking over the land for mall expansion.

Teacher In Guilty Plea

Mr. Wright was born Sept. 23, 1892, and had been employed by Mr. and Mrs. Henry Gerber, livestock ranchers for many years. He has relatives in California.

Burglary Trial Opened Here

Robert Dean Welch, 18-year-old Springfield youth, went on trial in circuit court Thursday morning for the Jan. 2 burglary of the Kingsley Field commissary. A 10-man, 2-woman jury was picked before court adjourned for lunch. Glenn D. Ramirez is defense attorney and Robert M. Redding is handling the case for the state.

Second Judge Sought Here

A three-man delegation from the Klamath County Bar Association left for Salem Wednesday evening to back a proposed bill for a second circuit judge for the county. President P. K. Puckett, Richard Beesley and Freeman Murray will talk to legislators and will appear before the Senate Judiciary Committee Friday morning. The bill has been endorsed and sponsored by Klamath County's Senator Harry Bolvin and representatives Carroll Howe and George Flitcraft.
