Many Dogs Unlicensed In County

More than 1,000 unlicensed dogs are subject to be picked up and taken to the County Dog Pound, according to estimates by County Clerk Charlie DeLap and Poundmaster Don Libby.

A last minute rush of dog owners purchased licenses for their pets before the Wednesday deadline, bringing the total of licenses sold to 5,000. It is estimated that at least 1,000 dogs remain unlicensed.

Licenses are still on sale at the county pound and in the county clerk's office but a \$2 penalty has been added. License fees amounted to \$13,604 last year and the total is expected to go higher this year. The money is used to support the pound and also provides a fund for payments to farmers of livestock killed by dogs.

Payments of \$324 were made in the first six months of this fiscal year for slaughtered livestock.

Libby said he and his staff would begin a drive to round up stray and unlicensed dogs this week.

Fear Demonstration At Sub Launching

PORTSMOUTH, N.H. (AP)—A new Polaris missile submarine, the Abraham Lincoln, will be commissioned March 11 in dockside ceremonies, but only invited guests can attend.

The Navy, announcing the date, said there will be no open house, as is customary.

A pacifist group, the New England Committee for Non-Violent Action, has announced plans to conduct a demonstration for disarmament.

The new submarine, nuclear powered, will be the fifth fleet Polaris weapon ship to go into commission.

She is 380 feet long and displaces 5,400 tons. Her missiles have a range of 1,200 miles.

Vice Adm. Elton W. Grenfell, a native of Fall River, Mass., will be the principal speaker at the ceremonies turning the ship over to Cmdr. Leonard Erb of Berlinville, Pa., and Cmdr. Donald W. Miller, Millersburg, Ohio.

The ship will have two complete crews, a "blue" crew under Cmdr. Erb, and a "gold" crew led by Cmdr. Miller.

With two crews, the ship can be kept in constant operation.

GRAZ, Austria (AP)—Police found farmer Karl Besendorfer in a field bleeding from head wounds. Before setting out to look for his assailant they questioned him. Besendorfer confessed he tried to beat himself to death with an ax but passed out after a couple of blows on the head.

Attorney's Murder Trial Opens Monday

FORT PIERCE, Fla. (AP)—Handsome, persuasive Joseph A. Peel Jr., once a promising West Palm Beach attorney, will go on trial for his life Monday in Florida's most sensational murder case.

Accused of masterminding the 1955 killings of Circuit Judge Curtis E. Chillingworth and his wife, Marjorie, Peel will be tried in a courtroom where Chillingworth himself had presided in the past.

Peel is charged with hiring Floyd A. (Lucky) Holzapfel, a notorious Florida hoodlum, and George (Bobby) Lincoln, a Negro moonshiner, to get rid of Chillingworths.

The bodies were never found but Holzapfel and Lincoln confessed in detail how they carried out the bizarre crime.

Peel's reason for wanting Chillingworth had evidence that he was operating a liquor and gambling payoff racket and intended to expose him. Peel was a city judge at the time.

Peel is held under maximum security conditions. He steadfastly maintains that Holzapfel and Lincoln lied when they implicated him. Visitors are not allowed in his cell.

Under a change of venue that brought the trial here from West Palm Beach, Circuit Judge D. C. Smith will preside. He wonders what he will do about the expected horde of would-be spectators and the reporters who want to cover the trial.

There are just 100 hard wooden chairs for the audience. The jurors also will sit in unupholstered chairs mounted on cast iron pedestals and bolted to the creaking floor.
