Water Content Shows Deficit

MOUNT SHASTA—Snow depths on March 1, as recorded by District Forest Ranger John C. Watt, show more snow but less water content than a year ago. At Horse Camp (Mt. Shasta) snow this year stands at 104.1; with water standing 34.2 inches. Last year 81.4 inches of snow held 33.6 inches of water.

Sand Flat shows a greater deficiency. Snow a year ago stood at 66.2 inches, and held 26.9 inches of water. This year 97.8 inches holds but 24.5 inches of water.

Skiers like the powder, but ranchers like to see more water in their snow measurements.

Weather vagaries are illustrated by a report made by Frank M. Ashell, meteorologist for Mount Shasta. During the winter 1897-98, no snow was recorded in Mount Shasta for the months of December, January, and February. During the same three-month period in 1889-90 the snowfall was 270.5 inches.
