Wood of Southern California said, "I think that Jim Berberich played one of the greatest basketball games that has been played against any club I've ever coached." SC beat UCLA Friday, but Berberich scored 33.

—UCLA's John Wooden was the personification of the sportsman-like loser: "My sincere congratulations to Twogio and the SC Coast Athletic Conference title team. I feel that they have the best team in the league."

Donovan, whose Loyola team meets Pepperdine tonight in a game that should clinch the

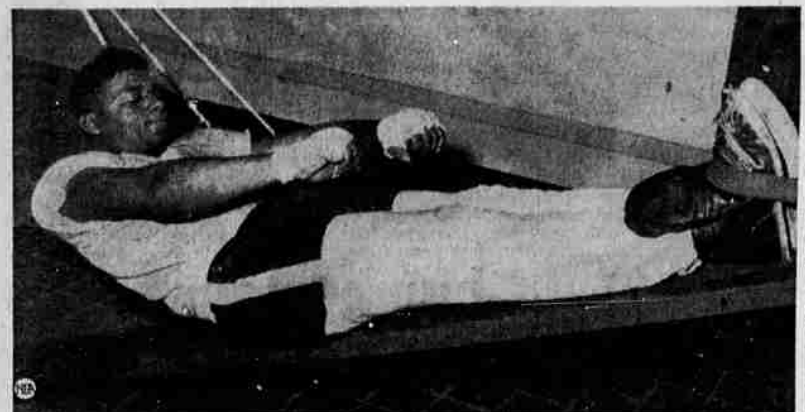
WCAC title for the Lions, had more to say.

PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Ingemar Johansson's private countdown had reached two today, meaning that Wednesday will be his final workout for his title quest against heavyweight champion Floyd Patterson in Miami Beach Monday night.

After Wednesday Ingo will just sit tight, girding his strength to reach the crown.

He made several things clear after Monday's workout, during which he again boxed a total of six rounds with three sparring partners.

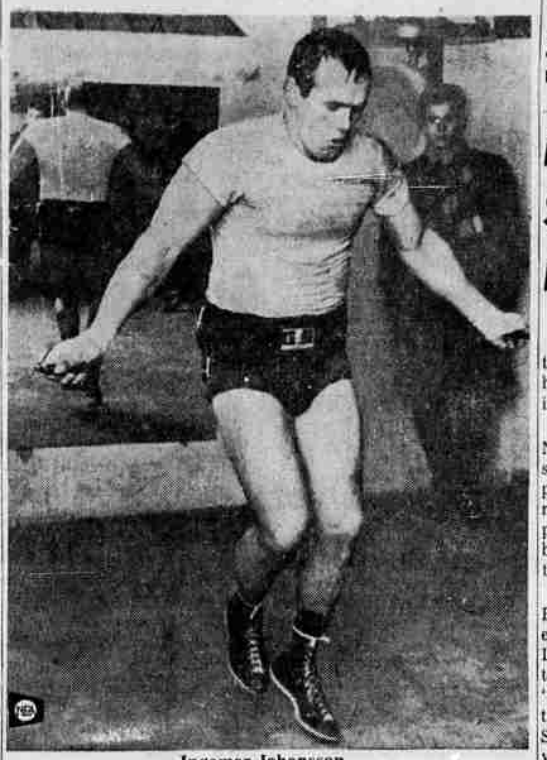
Johansson said Patterson won't clip him with a left hook as he did in knocking Ingemar out in their second meeting last June. He said he was caught inexplicably motionless in midring, right hand raised in sort of a salute. It won't happen again, he promised.

He also declared his right hand will shoot out so fast that if he misses with it, Patterson won't have time to cross a left over it before he closes in.

Ingemar also confirmed what many thought they had noticed. He is fighting lower now.

"That way when a guy rushes you, you can withstand the charge, and not be carried backward," he explained.

The burly Swede said he had no apprehensions about being knocked cold again; that he has no mental block that would prevent him from turning loose with his right for fear of a quick reprisal.

Baseball Contract Beefs Get Louder

Baseball's contract disputes are becoming louder. Pitcher Bob Shaw fired a broadside at the Chicago White Sox Monday and the Milwaukee Braves sounded an ultimatum to outfielder Wes Covington.

Shaw told The Associated Press: "If the White Sox don't want me, I don't want the White Sox—I've yielded as much as I intend to. I'm ready to be traded."

General Manager John McHale of the Braves said in response to Covington's rejection of the club's latest proposal: "He had his chance; we've done our part."

McHale said Covington, 29, accompanied his latest refusal with a suggestion "nothing short of amazing."

"He not only wanted the same pay as for his poor 1960 campaign (249 with 10 homers and 35 RBIs) but said we could cut if he didn't have a good year. That's against baseball rules," McHale said.

Dupas Eyes Next Fight

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Classy welterweight contender Ralph Dupas today eyed a nontitle bout with champion Benny (Kid) Paree after winning a unanimous 10-round decision over middleweight Joey Giardello.

The fast-moving New Orleans fighter swiftly moved out of reach of Giardello's famed left hook and three quick left-right-left combinations in rapid succession to bewilder the Philadelphia Monday night.

Dupas, the third-ranked welterweight, weighed in at 149, spotting Giardello, who's ranked fifth among middleweights, 11 pounds.

White Esneault, Dupas' manager, said he wanted to sign his classy protégé for a nontitle match with Paree. He declined to discuss any details of a proposed bout with the welterweight list.

The win was the 67th triumph against 14 losses and six draws for the 25-year-old Dupas. Giardello now has 84 victories, 20 defeats and six draws.

Buc Power Showing Up; Boss Beams

The Pittsburgh Pirates will be tougher than ever this year if they hit with the power they're showing in spring drills.

The world champions led the National League in batting last season but their 120 home runs placed them sixth in that department and a general lack of explosive batting punch is viewed by their rivals as a possible fatal weakness in 1961.

But a visitor to Fort Myers, Fla., Monday would have been excused for thinking Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig & Co. had come back to life the way the Bucs were "bustin' the ball. Bill Mazeroski, the 1960 World Series hero, Dick Stuart and Roberto Clemente provided most of the power as they clouted no less than 21 balls out of the park.

Stuart hit nine "homers," Clemente had seven and Mazeroski hit five to pace the drill which had manager Danny Murtaugh beaming. Murtaugh has been insisting since the start of spring training that the Pirates' rivals are underestimating the strength of the club.

Murtaugh also announced that he will start 20-game winner Vern Law, 18-game winner Bob Friend and relief star Eloy Face next Friday in the Pirates' exhibition opener with the Cincinnati Reds.

Frank Bolling, who is slated to play second-base regularly, made his competitive debut with the Milwaukee Braves and hit a two-run homer off Don McMahon. Lew Burdette pitched three hitless innings in the game and Joe Adcock hit two "homers" in pregame practice in other highlights of the Milwaukee workout.

The Chicago Cubs' intra-squad game turned into a comedy of errors, with 15 miscues being committed. There also were 12 walks, two hit batsmen and a balk to keep the Cubs' eight coaches awake nights.

Other camp notes: Joe Koppe hit a homer and a double in the Philadelphia Phillies' intra-squad game... Shortstop Len Cardenas, Wally Post and Joe Gaines homered during the Reds' game... Rookie Chuck Hinton's homer was the big news of the Washington Senators' game.
