Games were played later in the evening.



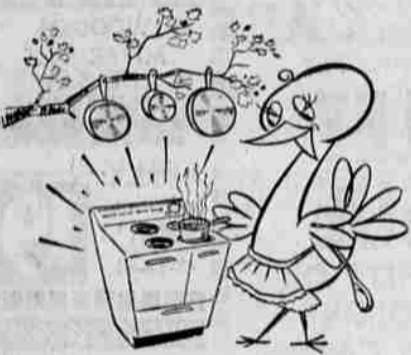

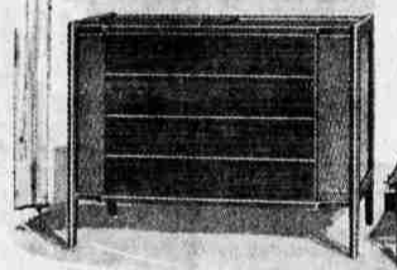
