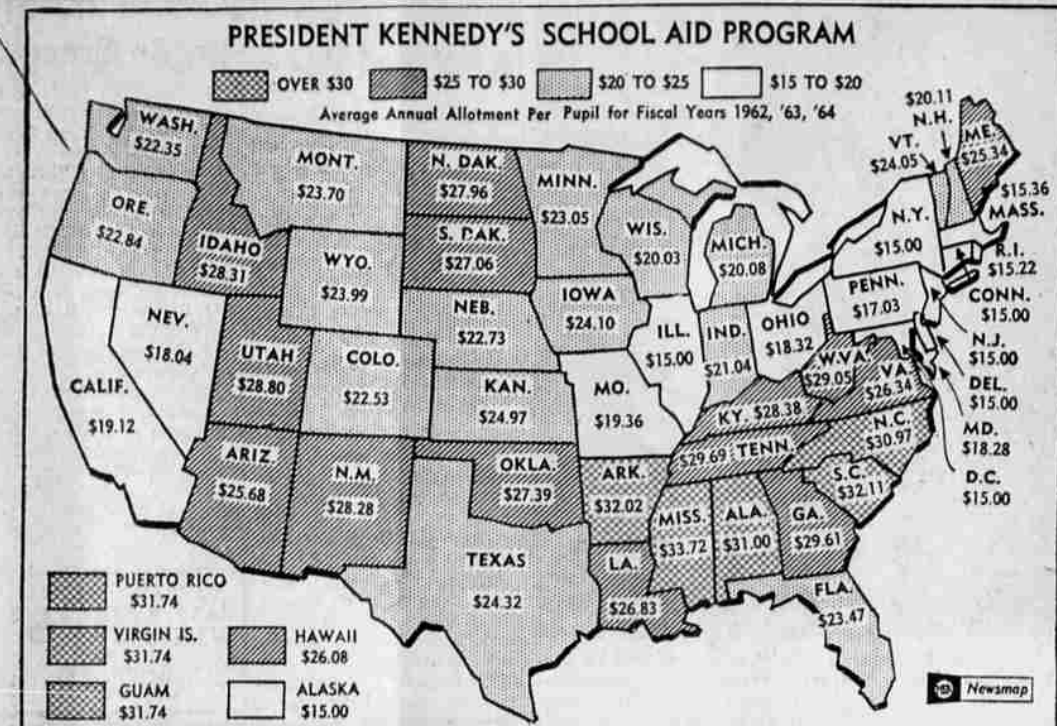

Baptists Set Easter Goal

The pastor of Bible Baptist Church, the Rev. Freeman Schmitt, the Sunday School superintendent, Reuben Larson, the church secretary, Verna Balzer and the church board have set a goal of every seat full by Easter in the "March to Sunday School in March" appeal to families.

And there is reason at Bible Baptist for every member of the family to be in a Sunday School class for there is provision made for every age group from infants to grandparents.

The entire church building shines with cleanliness, warmth and friendliness.

There are 10 cribs in the nursery where an attendant is on full time duty during the Sunday School hour and the church service. The rooms include germ lights for health safety, locker space for "necessities." The superintendent of the department is a registered nurse.

Loud speakers from the auditorium are in the toddlers' department where children are tagged with their formulas and where they play with safe toys. There are 60 children in these two departments of the Sunday School under 2 years old.

Classes are provided in separate areas for all other groups with the high school bracket one of the strongest in the church, which has 11 departments, 51 classes and approximately 20 teachers, helpers, and departmental superintendents.

The church provides recorded sermons by the pastor and church music to be played for shut-ins. There is a prayer room and a recently added library. A bus is operated to provide transportation for those otherwise unable to reach church and Sunday School. Women of the congregation have made attractive brown and turquoise choir robes. Former buildings on the church property are used for recreation, large meetings and dinners.

The buildings contain at least 10 pianos. The beautiful sanctuary is highlighted with the warmth of wood paneling. A stained glass window rises above the copper baptismal font behind the pulpit. A modern kitchen is provided. Pink pumice tile has been used for construction.

The church, one of the most attractive in the South Suburban district, is located at 224 Ward Street with an entrance also on South Sixth.

Thieves broke through a trap door in the floor Wednesday and looted four vending machines.



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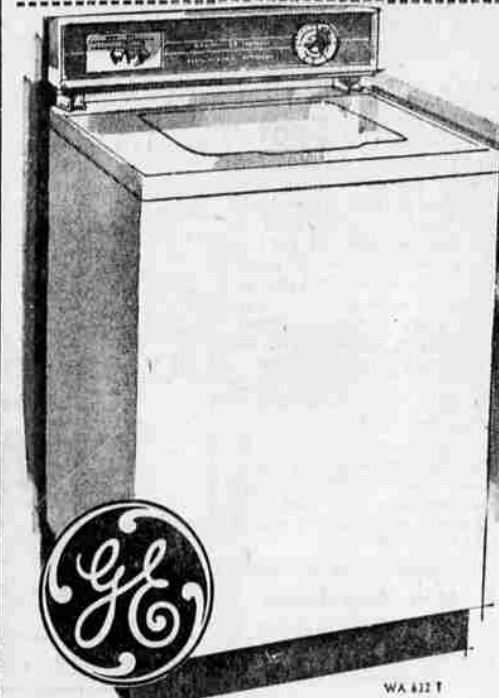
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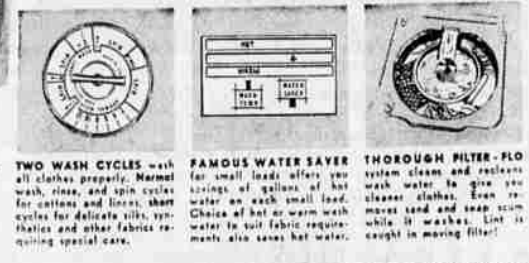
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
